Dear Friends,

Most people have no idea what life is like in prison. For some, there is a desire not to want to know about who ends up in prison and what the struggle is for those in prison and their families. We can honestly say that for the government, the needs of the people in the prison system are not a high priority. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is a constant call to remind everyone that we bring the good news to those in prison. They do not lose their dignity. For the past few years, St. Patrick has participated in an outreach to the women's prison in Perryville called, "Get on the

Bus." Throughout the year parishioners screen family members of inmates in the Perryville prison and prepare them to go to the prison and see their mothers. This is done during Mother's Day week. The very first year, we had only six inmates participate, but word began to spread about the ministry and last year we had five buses along with Catholic Charities counselors on each bus, to bring families to see their mothers in prison.

Sometimes we think there is no goodness found in prison, and yet last year at our presentation to the parish we heard the story of the need for a lockdown for the unit of 1,200 inmates to prepare for the arrival of families. Usually, it takes time to complete a lockdown, yet last year it took the 1,200 inmates 15 seconds to lock down. They knew mothers in the unit wanted to see their loved ones and they supported them. There is God in the midst of pain and brokenness.

On Friday, May 10, Get on the Bus will be ready to welcome and take the families to Perryville. We will report how it went. Last year after their families left, the women were allowed to share their joy and stories with each other. It does make a difference. Let's pray for healing and love to take place next week.

Christian Disciples in Mission Living Beyond Sunday

Loving in Deed and Truth

You have probably heard the saying "actions speak louder than words." In our second reading today John offers us a similar simple but challenging message, "love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." The challenge is when we say we are Christian we should then allow our faith to transform every aspect of our lives. Maybe ask yourself the question, how does being Catholic change anything about my life? Hopefully we can say our faith makes a difference with how we choose to live our lives. This is the challenge of not just loving in word or speech but loving in deed and truth. It is the challenge of loving as Christ loves.

Sometimes we struggle with knowing how we are called to live out our faith. We often let our insecurities or fears dictate how involved we are in the life of the church. Many times we feel like we are not qualified or we simply say "someone else could do that." However, in our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Paul gives us the perfect example of what it means to "love in deed and truth." St. Paul begins by simply sharing his own story with others in Jerusalem and it leads him to become the most influential Christian missionary in the world. He shares his truth of how he experienced Christ and how it completely changed his life. If you feel lost

with where God is calling you to serve, perhaps begin where St. Paul began: share your truth, share your story of how Christ has impacted your life. Evangelization begins with us going out and sharing our story with others.

As our faith involves a personal encounter with Christ, it also involves personal encounters with others. To have those encounters, however, we need to push past our insecurities and fears and become involved. As John warns us, we cannot choose to love in word alone, we need to let the love of Christ guide how we love in deed and truth. You never know where God might want you to serve; you never know how your story might impact another. Take some time this week and prayerfully meditate on how God might be calling you to share your story and how you can put your faith into action.

Stewardship

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, you call me into a life abundant with authentic love - a love that is more than just words. Help me to make this love known through my actions. Bless the love I give with fruitfulness, so that others may be drawn closer to love themselves. I ask this in the name of lesus Christ. Amen.

It's easy to say, "I love you." Consider that phrase for a moment. It communicates a great deal in just three words. We can say it to a family member, a friend, a dog, or even a piece of pizza. The phrase is really easy to say, but it's in our actions that the words come to life and are proven true or untrue.

Actions follow beliefs

In this first reading from Acts, we hear about Saul's difficulty in getting the apostles to trust him and his post-conversion intentions. It was only after Saul (later, Paul) proved his intentions with his actions through bold preaching that they believed him to be sincere. St. John makes a similar point in the second reading. It's not enough to love merely in "word and speech;" we must also love "in deed, and truth." God sees whether we truly love one another in our actions. This really is the heart of the metaphor.

Christ gives us in the gospel: He is the vine, and if we are connected to him, we will bear fruit. Those who only claim to be connected, will not bear fruit. It's as though Jesus is saying, "Thank you for proclaiming you love me. Now let's see that Love put into action."



Through our Annual Water Drive here at St. Patrick Catholic Community we have the option to step forward and assist organizations like André House, St. Vincent de Paul, and the City of Phoenix who serve the wider population of those who struggle with their everyday basic needs. Because of our partnerships with these organizations, the water that we collect here at St. Patrick will assist over 30 different agencies and their clients throughout the Valley!!


