Last weekend we had the honor of helping family members across the state visit their loved ones at Perryville - the only AZ Women's Prison. The great work of Katie Woodward and a good number of parishioners, who spent hours interviewing family members and seeing to other pre-arrangements needed, made this possible. I am grateful to all of them and the many others who made this special day possible. This ministry helps us live Matthew Chapter 25 of visiting those in prison.

Three buses with 130 people including five volunteer counselors from Catholic Charities to help with the difficulty that a family member might go through, is a great sign of comfort and support to loved ones in prison. I know of one parishioner who told me they will be driving to San Carlos on the reservation to bring the family to the parish to get on the bus and then return them home that evening. This story and the many other stories make me so proud to be your Pastor.

Outreach/Social Justice is central to our Catholic faith and the misunderstanding and myths that are created by people who are afraid of understanding Biblical Justice and Outreach are opportunities to have a conversion, thanks to parishioners and many other people who do great things to care for others.

Again, my gratitude to the many people who made this event possible and it will be done again next year.

Christian Disciples in Mission....Prayer Shawl Ministry

Dear Ministry Members:

It is with great appreciation for your Ministry that I share my experience with you. . Approximately six weeks ago, Bertha Koedell, gave me a gift of a Prayer Shawl. This past Christmas Eve my heart went into AFIBULATION to my great distress. I have had a heart attack, surgery and a stroke which increases the AFIB's chance of another heart attack or stroke which alerted my medical team. Spirituality and prayer are essential to this 83 year old. Bertha's gift was much appreciated. My belief is that life and healing is based on God, Family and Friends without which we cannot exist.

NOW, I will tell you of my miracle centering on your Prayer Shawl and God's blessing. Received Bertha's gift on a Wednesday and wore it while praying my daily rosary. The Shawl is warm and beautiful. To correct my Afib the doctors in January did an oblation within my heart's left ventricle, February, paddles/electrical shock and in March implantation of a Watchman within my heart's left ventricle. My heart remained in AFIB. On Thursday, the day after receiving my Shawl, I again wore it while saying my daily rosary and YES, my heart resumed normal sinus rhythm. I alerted my wife and thanked our good Lord for my recovery. Today, I am in normal sinus rhythm! My Cardiologist is happy saying the heart must have healed from the January oblation. I believe that Your Shawl/God proves the power of prayer. Prayer and my Shawl were worn when my heart converted to normal rhythm.

Thank everyone for your ministry and the work you do, MAY GOD BLESS YOUR EFFORTS! I will treasure my Shawl forever and the blessings it has brought me.





Why We Collect Water

are most vulnerable in our community. Catholic teaching proclaims that a basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring. The sanctity of human life and the inherent dignity of the human person is the foundation of all the principles of our Catholic Social Teaching.

During our summer months, we collect water for organizations that provide this basic necessity to those struggling with and experiencing homelessness. According to a recent article by PBS, extreme heat beats out hurricanes, tornadoes, and floods as the leading cause of weather-related death. Many of us have the opportunity to shelter ourselves indoors with regulated temperatures. For those living on the streets, shelter usually means some sort of canvas tent which absorbs heat and actually increases the temperature by roughly five degrees. Those who reside in uninhabited buildings, cars, or sidewalks continue to feel the heat long after the sun sets. This is because of what is called the "Urban Island Effect."

Combined with the lack of vegetation in the inner city, density of buildings, and concrete, the heat of the day remains for hours. Those who are homeless are 200 times more likely to die from extreme heat than housed people. The one life-saving and most essential element that experts agree upon to help those in need is.....Water!

"When someone is dehydrated, it affects everything. They are at higher risk for heat exhaustion and heat stroke, of course, but other health issues are worse, like asthma and COPD. Dehydration puts you at risk for kidney failure, especially if you have to take diuretics for heart failure, which is very common in the homeless population.

The solution is easy in that they need access to clean water. Our data shows bottled water is the most common source for the homeless population, which means they rely on people to hand it out, or many buy it with their precious funds."




