I remember in my prayers this week all the people who have sacrificed their lives for an end to racial discrimination. May God honor their lives.



## Share Your Faith...by Torri Winn

I am a team member with our Adult Initiation Ministry and what a joy it is to walk alongside those who are discerning if they should live their faith as a Catholic Christian! I remember a time, though, when I felt like

Jeremiah in Chapter 1:6, where God calls him and he says, "I know not how to speak; I am too young." That was how I felt when I was first asked to teach religious education at 20 years old. Yes, I went to Catholic school all the way through college, and yes, I went to Mass almost every day from birth onward, but what did I REALLY KNOW ABOUT GOD?! That line even resonates as we get older and is sometimes the reason we don't really talk




about our faith to others. I hear people all the time say, "Well I don't talk about faith matters, because I might get it wrong." Or, "If they challenge me about what I believe, I won't know what to say," (and what they don't say at the end of that sentence is...and I might look stupid). So we don't share our faith.

Yes, we might not know the answers to their questions, and yes, we may even look uneducated in our faith, but there is one story that can always be told when sharing faith, and that's how Jesus has shown up in our own lives. We've heard at Mass that the Word of God isn't just for "them then" but "for us now!" So how do you figure that out? Now it helps to be aware of how God shows up. And the best place to develop a firm foundation is to read in the scriptures how God has shown up for those in the scriptures, and seeing if there are any similarities in our own lives. I think, for me, there is one more element that is required to recognize our story in the stories of scripture and that is an act of surrender, or maybe as St. Paul says it, a renewal of the mind, that acknowledges that my story is indeed in that book written so long ago. The Lord says to Jeremiah, "Don't say, 'I am too young' (or for us in the more mature crowd - 'I'm afraid I might look stupid if I get it wrong') - the Lord says, "to whomever I send you, you shall go, whatever I command you, you shall speak. Have no fear before them, because I am with you..." He is saying just be open to God. Surrender to God so that He can use you in ways you could never imagine. Like talking to people about faith in Adult Initiation or writing an article in the church bulletin!

The Lord goes on to tell Jeremiah after he touches his mouth, that He will "Place His Words in his Mouth!" That's the wonderful HOLY SPIRIT! So we don't even have to worry about what to say - but only if we surrender it all to the Lord before we even part our lips, trusting that He is there and will give us what we need.

So when we are tempted to say "what do I know" remember the many times God has shown up in your life, and ask the Holy Spirit to guide your tongue, thoughts and actions to "build and to plant in the portion of the Kingdom called Scottsdale Arizona," or wherever you find yourself!



#### **Social Justice**

#### **Parental Awareness about Trafficking**

Two of the most common forms of Human Trafficking are sex trafficking and labor trafficking. Sex traffickers prey upon the vulnerable teen population by offering false promises of love, security and material temptations. This social



issue recognizes no socio-economic background. The numerous social media platforms and easy accessibility to the internet make it more difficult to be vigilant for parents. **Here are a few tips to help keep your teens safe:** 

**Listen and be proactive:** Teens struggle with peer pressure and social acceptance. Continued communication about their daily lives away from home helps keep an awareness that you are active in their lives.

**Encourage extracurricular activities:** Athletics, arts, and volunteer activities help build self-esteem and self-worth while developing interpersonal skills. Studies show that inactive teens spend up to nine hours every day consuming media.

**Know who is reaching out to your teen:** Stay vigilant with whom your teen is regularly communicating. Traffickers contact their victims online, through social media, and game apps. Traffickers look for messages like "I just got into a fight with my parents" or "My parents don't understand me." Especially any statement that screams for attention after a misunderstanding.

**Advise** them how to say no and put a contact plan in place should there be a need for them to remove themselves from a bad situation.

**Question** when you see sudden possession of new items like electronics, purses, clothing, jewelry, makeup, etc. or a sudden change in appearance/clothing. Are they in possession of unexplained cash or a "second" cell phone?

**Ensure** that your teen knows your phone number by heart and not relying on a contact list. If they need to reach out in an emergency from a different phone should their phone get lost or confiscated, they will know how to contact you.

**Remind** your teen that anything posted on the internet is there forever. Know your teens' passwords and regularly check their activity. You have that right as a parent.

**Be aware of red flags** like missing a lot of school or rapid decline in school performance.

**Trust your instincts** as a parent. If something feels wrong, acknowledge it! Don't ignore or rationalize it. Reach out for guidance if necessary.


