My Mental Health: Do I Need Help?

First, determine how much your symptoms interfere with your daily life.



Do I have mild symptoms that have lasted for less than 2 weeks?

- · Feeling a little down
- Feeling down, but still able to do job, schoolwork, or housework
- Some trouble sleeping
- · Feeling down, but still able to take care of yourself or take care of others



If so, here are some self-care activities that can help:

- · Exercising (e.g., aerobics, yoga)
- Engaging in social contact (virtual or in person) Talking to a trusted friend or family member
- Getting adequate sleep on a regular schedule
- · Eating healthy
- · Practicing meditation, relaxation, and mindfulness

If the symptoms above do not improve or seem to be worsening despite self-care efforts, talk to your health care provider.



Do I have severe symptoms that have lasted 2 weeks or more?

- · Difficulty sleeping
- Appetite changes that result in unwanted weight
 Loss of interest in things you usually find enjoyable changes
- Struggling to get out of bed in the morning because of mood
- Difficulty concentrating
- · Unable to perform usual daily functions and responsibilities
- · Thoughts of death or self-harm



Seek professional help:

- Psychotherapy (talk therapy)—virtual or in person; individual, group, or family
- Medications
- Brain stimulation therapies






Social Justice

The Safe Haven law, ARS 13-3623.01 now allows a parent or designated agent to anonymously relinquish an unharmed infant up to 30 days old, to a designated Safe Haven provider.

Recently, the Social Justice and Outreach core team and staff here at St. Patrick Catholic Community have had the opportunity to develop a relationship and receive training from an organization called



Staff received the training in July from CEO Heather Burner on what steps to take should a mother bring a child to the parish grounds who feel they are unable to properly care for their birth child rather than just abandon the baby. Rather than abandoning an infant, it gives the desperate mother options and resources while also giving a very strong chance for the child to survive.

The mother (or her agent) may *choose to* leave her information at which time she would be connected to an AZ Safe Baby Haven crisis response team. The team will connect with the mother and would help her navigate different options like temporary placement, foster care, adoption, or relinquishment.

Should the mother *choose not* to give any personal information and leave the premises, the child will be accepted, 9-1-1 would be called and the fire department would transport the child to the nearest hospital for assessment. The child will be cared for and eventually placed into a loving home.

Run to God's Love...by Adam Stein

"This saying is trustworthy and deserves full acceptance, Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." We find this line tucked into the middle of the second reading. This one sentence beautifully sums up the rest of what we hear in our readings this weekend. We are sinners. We all fall short. We make mistakes. We make bad decisions. We don't always choose the right paths... and yet, Jesus still chose to come into the world!

Why? Jesus wants to save us, to restore us, to be in relationship with us. This is nothing new. In the first reading, we hear God speaking to Moses about His people, a people who God brought out from Egypt, and how they still turn away from Him. In this conversation, God sets aside any wrath, a wrath the people deserved, and keeps the relationship first. God calls the people, in love, back. This wasn't the first time God did this, and it won't be the last. (The whole Bible is not only full of stories like this, but it in and of itself is the story of God calling us back to Him...Exodus is only the second book!)

Jesus continues to reveal this story to us in the Gospel. People are trying to use Jesus' relationship with sinners as a character attack against him. As usual, Jesus takes the opportunity to reveal a different perspective. Why wouldn't he be dining with sinners? Using the parables we hear, He teaches about a God that wants everyone to return. God desires that no one remain lost. God's desire to live in love with each one of us is so strong that God will seek us out, always calling us back. However, this doesn't mean we don't have a part to play. We cannot remain complacent with sin. We must repent and return to our God, who is waiting with open arms. God's love for us is bigger than anything we think can or does divide us ~ Run to God's love.






