
Let us make it part of our daily prayer routine to ask the Holy Spirit for the courage to act in Jesus' name no matter the consequences.

Rhythms...Mary Permoda

I am fascinated by rhythms - the ebb and flow of things. I think I finally have the rhythm of the best time to plant tomatoes here in Arizona (never!). There is a rhythm in academia, sports, elections, families, holidays and even in our life and church life.

The rhythm of the church is winding down our liturgical year with the Feast of Christ the King on Sunday, November 20

and we will celebrate the beginning of the new liturgical year with the first Sunday of Advent on Sunday, November 27. Our liturgical year follows the life and death of Jesus Christ. Advent we proclaim the birth of Jesus and follow him to the cross of Lent, resurrection at Easter, the birth of the church at Pentecost and finally proclaiming Christ is the Lord of our life and King of Glory on Christ the King. Then the rhythm starts all over again.

You might notice that the readings we hear at Mass now through the end of the liturgical year are focusing on the end times. In the words of Fr. Eric..."the answer to any question is death and resurrection". How many times have you heard him say that? If you didn't believe him before, maybe you will see this rhythm in your own life this year!



The past few weeks our parish life has witnessed to death and resurrection in so many ways. Beginning with the October 29 Family Mass. There were more young children at the Saturday evening Mass than I have ever seen at that Mass! Fr. Eric invited them all to sit up around the altar for the homily. The energy and passion of our little ones was palatable! You could feel the spirit! Then at the same time all around the altar were the photos of our deceased family and friends. A beautiful contrast of death and resurrection.

Halloween/All Saints'/All Souls' Day couldn't be a clearer sign of the rhythm of death and resurrection. And I bet you didn't think about this, our Fall Festival has only been around for two years. It was birthed out of COVID and was our first parish wide event after COVID. What was a death experience figuratively and literally brought new life. By the way....Fall Festival was a great success!

I am reminded that there is death and resurrection all around me every day all the time.

Death and resurrection IS the miracle of our faith - when you are looking for God and wondering if God is present in your life, look for death and I bet resurrection is right around the corner. Wherever you find this rhythm you will find the living God ever present.

I challenge you to look for death and resurrection experiences this week in your home, family, work, outside activities and share the miracle story with one person this week.

Social Justice

Continuing from last week, there were six social circumstances identified that contributed towards perpetuating food

insecurity and hunger. The Just Faith (Hunger) adult formation sessions helped bring awareness to these issues:



Underemployment: As opposed

to unemployment, underemployment pertains to those who are employed, however their jobs do not pay enough to cover all of their monthly living expenses. Common jobs linked to underemployment are fast-food restaurants, convenience stores, hospitality industry catering to vacationers, warehouse jobs, agriculture industry, etc. Shift work is commonly physically demanding and injuries are common which results in loss of work and pay.

Lack of Education: At the very least, a high school or technical degree is needed. Lack of nutrition has a direct impact in the early stages of childhood and development. A vicious cycle occurs with generational poverty and many become limited to a third grade reading level. Energy levels and focus are low. For adults, because of hunger and workload, those who want to obtain a degree do not have the energy and do not want to go further into debt.

Family Structure: Those who come from a broken home do not have resources for networking or support systems. Factors like child care play a factor and get especially difficult for single parents vs. married parents, or single income families vs. dual income. Hunger rate amongst SINGLE parents is four times the rate of a married/couple household.

Race and Hunger: Many are living in areas which lack integrated neighborhoods, churches, and social groups. Our current fragmented society ensures that the systemic problems of domestic hunger will persist, if not become worse. Middle class is being squeezed out while those in poverty become more oppressed.

Aging and Decline of Mental Health: With aging comes the possibility of mental decline which leads people to forget the basic everyday things.....like eating. Without family structure or resources, there is no one to recognize that this decline is taking place. Or, some just refuse to acknowledge this life event occurring. Many elders on fixed incomes cannot pay for food services or lack the necessary social networking to help them obtain subsidized meals.

The Need to Make Trade-Offs: Those on a very fixed income or living paycheck to paycheck (underemployment) are most affected by this. One unforeseen medical bill or car repair can force a person to make a difficult decision to either not be able to pay rent or buy groceries. If a person has no means of transportation, they do not work which equates to not getting paid.

Burial Shrouds

Did you know that St. Patrick is in need of people who like to sew, trace crosses, cut out crosses and put them together?

There is a small group of people doing the above and are in need of help. We provide the materials and all of the work can be done at home or at our once a month meeting.

The above process, when finished, is used as Burial Shrouds for Fr. Rick in Haiti. Fr. Rick has been working with the poorest of the poor in Haiti for over 25 years. On a monthly basis an average of 15 men, women, and children are buried mostly due to malnutrition. Fr. Rick goes to the morgue to obtain bodies and gives them a proper funeral. As there are no caskets, the Burial Shrouds are placed over the bodies before being interred.
