Dear Friends,

When one finds oneself dealing with a serious issue, crisis, or serious health concern there is so much to deal with. One can become occupied with the many tasks that need to be done and full attention must be given to the most important things to do.

In the midst of everything, we might want to remember that when one is unable to come to Mass regularly for serious reasons, it is good to call the Parish Office and

request Holy Communion be brought to the person(s). The Ministry of Care is made up of trained parishioners, who can bring Communion, prayers, and spiritual items to those who are homebound, in care facilities, hospitals, and other places of care. I have come across people who have gone many weeks or even months without receiving Holy Communion. Sometimes they are overwhelmed with all that is happening or unfortunately one assumes that no one is available to bring Communion to them.

So I remind all parishioners who might find themselves, family members, friends, or neighbors who are unable to attend Mass for serious reasons, to please call St. Patrick and request the Ministry of Care to bring Communion. Holy Communion might be just the right thing for those who feel lonely, separated from others, or in need of healing.

I am grateful to all the Ministers of Care who give their time to visit the sick and homebound. They do make a big difference to those in need.

Family Promise: Countering a Culture of Indifference

Over the past few years Pope Francis has made it a point to talk about the growing culture of indifference we are facing around the world. With so much happening around the world it can be easy to feel hopeless, criticize, or simply feel indifferent to the hardships people are facing. Indifference has long been a challenge to overcome, but with modern technology it has become easier than ever for us to isolate ourselves, to retreat into our own world or a world accessible only to those who think exactly the same way we do. Pope Francis directs us to the parable of the Good Samaritan, to approach a stranger with compassion and a tender heart. In societies often polluted by a culture of indifference and waste, he said that "as believers, we are called to go against the tide with a culture of tenderness, that is, of caring for others as God has cared for us: for me, for you, for each one of us."



It can become easy to take the little blessings we have in life for granted. Simple things like a roof over our heads, food in the refrigerator, or clean clothes to change into. Programs like Family Promise seek to develop comprehensive, holistic solutions for families facing homelessness. Over 80% of families in Family Promise's shelter program exit to stable housing. St. Patrick is proud to partner with organizations like Family Promise in hosting families

who are looking for stable housing. In June, with the help of over 80 ministers, we hosted five families along with their children on campus in the House of Mercy. I would like to thank all the ministers who gave of their time, staying overnight, offering haircuts, providing home cooked meals, and all those who accompanied these families on their journey to find housing. Families were excited to have simple amenities like snacks and drinks available, simple things that many of us might take for granted.



The way we put an end to a culture of indifference begins with compassion and acts of charity. If you sense a growing feeling of indifference in your life

consider becoming involved in a ministry or

organization that seeks to help those in need. If you are interested in making a difference in someone's life, I encourage you to consider being a part of the Family Promise ministry as we hope to host more families in the future. Social Justice

Our Annual Back to School Drive will run from July 13 - July 28, 2024

Unfortunately, parental incarceration is only one of a series of separations and stressful situations facing children who have a parent or both parents involved in the criminal justice system.

Some of the common emotional consequences that children face because of this are: chronic sleeplessness, difficulties concentrating, and depression. Many times this is caused by the child internalizing problems who may blame themselves for their parent being in jail.

The most common burden and social stigma associated with this issue is embarrassment and ridicule. Many times they are teased or bullied at school thus leading to low self-esteem. Others may react with anger, defiance, or a desire to retaliate against those who reject or taunt them.

Many families are strained for money so this time of year is a huge financial sacrifice, especially if the parent is incarcerated hours and hours away. There are also instances when a prisoner has been moved and the family is not notified.

Our annual parish Back to School Supply and Gift Card Drive will run until July 28. School supplies will go to assist St. Matthew and Roadrunner Elementary schools. Any gift cards we collect will assist those children preparing for school who have a parent who is incarcerated and distributed to them by the Diocese Prison Ministry staff.

Water safety tips for swimmers of all ages



Learn to swim

Teach children at an early age -- it's the best defense against drowning



Pool barriers/fences

Install a fence that surrounds a residential pool on all sides to keep wandering children out



Avoid alcohol

Designate a "water watcher" who is not distracted or under the influence of drugs and alcohol to watch swimmers



Use the buddy system

If one person has a problem in the water, the other may be able to help



Vigilant supervision

If it looks like a swimmer needs assistance, intervene immediately



Don't hold your breath

Avoid games where you hold your breath underwater for long periods of time


