## The Epiphany....with John Seliga

When I was a kid, meaning a very young boy, we had always lived next to or not far from railroad tracks or rail yards. They were not the safest places. We knew it. So we were careful to stand clear when trains ran through. But we did run down to the railroad crossing to watch the trains when the ding-ding-ding sounded.

There was a certain curve in the tracks where the coal cars ran around the turn. When the cars were overloaded with coal and the train was running a little too fast, it made the top of the overloaded cars spill a lot of the heavy coal along the edge of the tracks.

In the dead of night we would take our burlap bags down to the edge of the tracks and pick the coal from the ground and load the bags. They were pretty heavy bags for a kid to carry!

The coal we picked would eventually be used in our stove. Yes, we had coal stoves. For the most part those coal stoves were the only source of fire in the house for cooking and heating to warm up the place.



There are other things about how we lived and from my view, at the time, they were all-right times - hard, but ok. I have six sisters and six brothers, the oldest of thirteen. What a growing up!

One day I had a flash, a sudden and striking realization. We were poor! But we did not know it. The people we knew, the neighborhood and people all around us were all in the same boat.

It was an Epiphany!

We use the word today in the sense of a swift insight that made things clear. But when I was growing up, Epiphany was some kind of church event. It was to do with three kings coming and C+M+B letters over a doorway. Do any of you remember those letters? Casper + Melchior + Balthasar, the Magi.

Epiphany! Sometimes the term is used to describe a sudden discovery by a scientist in a laboratory. Or maybe it's a doctor finding out why his patient is ailing and what could be the cure.

Today, Epiphany is celebrating the manifestation of Christ's divinity to Gentiles and to the world.



### **Social Justice**

During the month of January, the topic of Human Trafficking will be highlighted with information pieces both in the bulletin and

Connection. When large events (like the Super Bowl here in AZ this year) come to a local region, these types of social issues, which clearly violate the human



dignity of the person, tend to spike. Sex Trafficking and Labor Trafficking tend to be the most common sub-categories of human trafficking. These issues are local, national, and global. It is first important to define what they are:

Human Smuggling: The illegal movement of a person across a country's border. Smuggling is both transportation-based and border-based. Consent or agreement in some manner is usually given between two parties.

**Human Trafficking:** The person being victimized is exploitation-based. (Exploitation being defined as an action or fact of treating someone unfairly in order to gain personal benefit from their work.) This does not require movements across borders. Non-consent, deception, or false promises to the victim are normally involved.

Smuggling can lead to Trafficking if the smuggler then uses force-fraud-coercion to hold people against their will for exploitation purposes. Hotel, agriculture, dining, or domestic labor is where many are placed. The sex trade and/or a person forced to sell drugs in drug houses are also very common areas of illicit trades where the victim is forced to "work" for the trafficker.

Either way, both of these terms prey upon the vulnerabilities of the victims who share these common traits:

- Having few to no choices (fleeing crime ridden country, unemployment, famine, etc).
- Lack of resources or navigation skills to remove themselves (or family) out of bad situations.
- Broken family and/or no support system. (runaway, foster care system, abuse at home, etc). Feeling of little to no attention at home. This knows no socioeconomic boundaries.




