Blessed Bakers: Preparing for the Heavenly Feast

The account of the multiplication of loaves this week reveals the divine power of Jesus at work and it also shows the importance of food to foster community. The importance of food is seen throughout the Bible. In fact, the Bible begins and ends with a meal. The very first words of God to humans are an invitation to eat. The last act of Jesus before his death is sharing a meal with his disciples. In Scripture we also see a vision of heaven described as a joy-filled banquet.

The Lord's last supper is a foretaste of this heavenly banquet, which we participate in every time we come to Mass.



Food naturally draws us into communion

with one another. Just like a family who gathers together for dinner, we also come together to receive the Eucharist at Mass. That is why the Eucharist is also referred to as "Holy Communion." It is no coincidence that Jesus instituted the Eucharist within the context of a meal. Food by its very nature is communal. It should lead us to communion, with each other and with God. Gathering around a meal is a true form of hospitality because it draws us into fellowship with others.

St. Patrick always strives to offer hospitality and build community in all its ministries, but one ministry in particular which incorporates good food with community is called the Blessed Bakers. The Blessed Bakers serve to provide home-baked goods for various parish events and meetings throughout the year. By sharing your food with others you can help build community and help bring others closer to God through those relationships. If you have a love for baking and would like to be a part of bringing others closer together through food, I invite you to consider being a Blessed Baker. Jesus explained, "Who is greater: the one seated at the table or the one who serves? I am among you as the one who serves" (Lk 22:27). Offering food to others is an act of service that Christ displays for us by his example over and over again. Just look at the story of the multiplication of loaves. Consider




