Dear Friends,

Persons who have, or want, influence over people have come to believe that presenting views that are seen as negative, get people angry, or offering persons/people as the blame to problems, is what gets most people to respond. We have seen that going after people's most negative and fearful responses is what moves people to react to social concerns. I think most of us see that. In reflecting on what theme would be helpful to people of faith in the coming year, I felt that holding on to the idea of "Giving Thanks" is what will keep us centered in our faith lives.

There are things presented to us from so many directions that want us to know what is lacking in our lives, who is to blame for our worries, and justifying cruel behavior towards

others. It is seen as the way to accomplish what one wants. What gets lost is the heart of being grateful, and knowing God is offering a true peace that many in our country have lost.

This year I have wanted to present the theme of "Giving Thanks," reminding ourselves that being grateful can help us see life in a more hopeful way.

Some Christians are using their faith to cause fear and division, wanting power and influence, and that is not the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We can work for what is just and right, but always in the light of loving our neighbor. People can see very little use for living a Christian life when we lose ourselves in all this negativity. Our message is always about hope. Hope that our hearts can be grateful, that our behavior respects and honors all people, whether they respond in kind or not. We need to offer a life that helps recapture a time when we felt close to God and lived a life of honor, gratitude and praise.

Next week and the following week, our Liturgist Frank Dominguez and I will be presenting our theme of Giving Thanks and how this is lived at our Sunday Mass. How the role of every person at Mass and our gathering is the starting point each week to overcome the negative, the blaming, the poor behavior that is always before us. We look forward to breaking open this theme next weekend.

Stewardship

Almighty God, I thank you, today, for the gift of growth. For, if it weren't for our hardships and trials, we wouldn't fully appreciate how good you are. Please teach me how to grow well in my daily trials, especially through the gifts of patience and fortitude. Amen.

Making wine is a long and arduous process. Long before a bottle of wine ever gets opened, many seasons have passed, and hundreds of steps have taken place. The land must be procured, the soil must be right — tilled, and prepared before the seeds are ever planted. We hear a little about the process in the first reading from Isaiah and, again, mirrored in the Gospel. The wine press must be hewn, and a watchtower must be built, and this doesn't even speak to the need for proper weather conditions, the laborious work of the harvest, the pressing and seemingly never-ending wait during the fermentation process. All in all, it takes years to achieve something truly amazing when it comes to wine. The same can be said of the Christian.

The soil of our hearts must be right for the seed of God's Word to take root and thrive. It is only through our connectedness to God (the vine and the branches) and through building our lives on Christ, the cornerstone (the Gospel) that we can withstand the difficulties of the season. Sometimes we suffer. Sometimes our prayer lives are arid. Sometimes we are persecuted like Christ was (and still is) by others. We, like the grapes, undergo a great deal of duress but, in time, those are the grapes that produce the best juice and the sweetest taste. Through all these ups and downs and seasons of life, if we remain connected to Him who is true and that which is "honorable. just, pure, lovely, gracious, etc." as we hear from St. Paul, then we will know peace and we will, in time, bear great fruit. It is in "making our requests known to God" that we come to trust in His plan, His timing, and, ultimately, His will for our lives.

Social Justice

One tool or option to help keep an abuser away from you is to obtain an Order of Protection (OP) which can be issued from Superior court, any Justice of the Peace court (JP), or any Municipal court in Arizona during normal business hours. A law enforcement officer can



help you obtain an Emergency **Order of Protection after** business hours or holidays. An OP is only valid after it has been served and is valid for 24 months. If the person served violates the stipulations within this order, he or she can be arrested and jailed for this violation.

When applying for this order, you can and should stipulate that the person is to have no contact whatsoever either in person, by phone, electronically, or by social media. This order must be served by a process server (your cost) or a law enforcement officer (no cost). Once the order is served to the offender, the paperwork will be forwarded to the Maricopa Sheriff's Office and kept on file and is valid normally for up to 24 months. You should keep a copy as well. Keep in mind, however, that an OP is merely a piece of paper that obviously will not physically restrain someone from staying away should they choose to violate the order. It does not guarantee safety, so always be cognizant of your surroundings.

An OP seeks protection from someone you have lived with now or in the past. This applies to a current or former spouse, someone with whom you are having a romantic relationship, one party pregnant by the other party or have a child in common, your relative (ask the court for specifics), or one of the parties is a parent, grandparent, in-law, or sibling. Go to azpoint.azcourts.gov/ to get started.

For any emergency, call 9-1-1 and get to a safe place. For any other non-emergency concerns around domestic violence call the National Domestic Violence Hotline 24/7 at 1-800-799-7233 (SAFE).

You may also text "START" to 88788 or go to thehotline.org.

Keep an eye on the timing of your workouts. Exercise too close to bedtime can be stimulating.


Keep it comfortable


