There is a lot happening at St. Patrick and I want to remind you of some things to know.

The 101 Freeway will be going through some road construction for about two years. There will be certain weekends that the Northbound or the Southbound traffic will be closed. I would recommend that we use the website **az511.gov** to see how the traffic is being directed. Once we become familiar with the alternate routes to get to Mass, we should be fine. If you receive our weekly Email Connection we will try to keep everyone informed of the weekend situation with the freeway.

The Super Bowl will be coming up soon on Sunday, February 11. We move our Sunday 5:00 pm Mass to 12:30 pm for that day only. The attendance is much better at that time on that day as the Super Bowl is a big event. We even consider it a Holy Day at St. Patrick.

February 14 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Lenten season. Ashes will be distributed at two Masses that day, 8:00 am and 12:05 pm (live streamed and on demand afterwards). There will be four Word Services with distribution of ashes at 6:30 am in the Daily Mass Chapel, 10:00 am, 4:15 and 5:30 pm in the Church.

We are mailing our Lent/Easter packets to all registered parishioners, and in our Narthex we will have Lent/Easter resources for our guests and parishioners.

I would recommend receiving our weekly Email Connection as it has the most updated news for the parish community. It is sent out every Thursday. You can go to our parish website, **stpatcc.org**, to sign up or call the Parish Office if you need assistance on how to access it.

Stewardship

Opening prayer:

Heavenly father, you are not a reactive God. You do not make things up as you go. You love us more than that. You have a plan set in motion before we even realize the plan exists. Thank you for knowing and loving us perfectly. Amen

We are often reactive people. We may have a perfectly laid-out plan, but when something goes wrong, we usually react-and not in a positive way. God is not reactive. God is proactive. God always has a plan, even if we cannot readily discern or understand it.

In his farewell teaching from Deuteronomy, Moses assures the people that after he dies, they will be taken care of by a new prophet. He reminds the people of God's faithfulness and providence; God always has his bases covered. This truth speaks, not only to God's fidelity, but also to the reality of each person's unique vocation.

In the second reading, we hear St. Paul speak of different states in life and the vocation of marriage, Aga. He laid out for the Corinthians, how a married man has a different vocation than a single man and so forth. This passage is part of the script, reasoning for modern priests entering into the discipline and vow of celibacy. The vocation as a priest is not only a unique calling but also part of God's proactive plan for salvation.

This vocation is obvious in today's gospel. Excluding that time when he was 12 years old, this is the first time Jesus is teaching in a synagogue "as one having authority." This means that Jesus was teaching new things, things no Rabbi had ever taught before (which is kind of a big "no-no"). In this new ministry, Christ's vocation is seen in a bold, public light. God's proactive plan of salvation jumped into such a high gear that even the demons reacted to it.

Nurses Corner

BABY HEALTH

Tips from the American Academy of Pediatrics to reduce the risk of SIDSsleep-related infant death.

- The baby should sleep on a firm, flat non-inclined surface.
- Sitting devices, such as car seats, strollers, swings, infant carriers, and infant slings, are not recommended for routine sleep for infants younger than four months.
- Breastfeeding reduces the risk of sleep-related infant deaths, and while any human milk feeding is more protective than none, two months of feeding at least partial human milk has been demonstrated to significantly lower the risk of sleep-related deaths.
- Parents may sleep in the same room but not in the same bed as a baby.
- Avoid parent and infant exposure to nicotine, alcohol, marijuana, opioids, and illicit drugs.
- Make sure the baby receives routine immunizations.
- Pacifier use is associated with reducing risk.
- Avoid the use of commercial devices that claim to reduce the risk of SIDS or other sleep-related deaths.
 There is no evidence that any of these devices reduce the risk of these deaths.
- Supervised, awake tummy time is recommended to facilitate infant development. Parents are encouraged to place the infant in tummy time while awake and supervised for short periods of time beginning soon after hospital discharge, increasing incrementally to at least 15 to 30 minutes total daily by 7 weeks of age.
