First Down with Fr. Eric



Dear Friends,

Bishop John Dolan presided at the Cathedral television Mass on Sunday, September 4. It was a Mass of remembrance for those who are survivors of suicide incidents. It was a great homily that addressed our human understanding of why people take their own lives, and offering comfort to the family and friends who remain suffering the sadness of suicide. You may view the Mass on our past parish email Connection, or go to the Diocese of Phoenix web page or Facebook page to view.

Bishop Dolan also announced the establishment of an Office of Catholic Mental Health. This office will help with awareness, teaching and understanding of the importance of mental health. St. Patrick has offered some good information for resources and talks on mental health. We also have placed the information on our website and in the Narthex.

When one views the September 4 Mass, the people were invited to place a flower at the picture of Our Lady of Guadalupe to remember loved ones who have left us because of suicide. There was a very long line after the homily, which was a powerful statement that many people have experienced the sadness of suicide. By viewing the Mass, I hope many of us can find comfort through the Holy Spirit at this time.

Special note: From time to time people who do not have good intentions send out emails or texts using my name and asking for favors. This happens to many churches often. I will never send an email or text to anyone asking for personal assistance or a monetary personal favor. Please disregard any suspicious looking emails or texts saying it is your Pastor. I appreciate your attention to this matter.





Family Dinner...by Sharon Fabyanic

As we consider the idea of **Gather** this fall, my mind instantly goes to a gathering I know well, the dinner table. My own childhood was filled with family dinners. My parents were big entertainers and deeply

loved hosting. Having each grown up in households of seven and eight children, they knew only one motto, the more the merrier. Family Dinners were filled with tons of food and tons of stories and laughter. There was always room for an extra person and guests were encouraged. Some nights were more rushed as someone needed to be quickly out the door following the meal, but good food and connection were always present.





have regular family dinners have children that experience less depression and earn better grades in school. The Academy of Pediatrics linked family meals to healthier eating habits in children and adolescence. One article suggested that family dinner lead to better bonds within the family structure. I could continue on with the scholarly information, but the point is clear, there are tremendous benefits that come from a family meal. And while I am certain these studies were done with traditional families as the subjects, the research has implications for all of us. Family dinners are important. Gathering together and connecting, sharing a meal on a regular basis is key to our mental and physical health.

My parents were way better at family dinner than I have been as a mom. I have bought into the value and the importance, but I get stuck on all the wrong things. I worry about the "Pinterest perfect" recipe or the tablescape. I get stuck on the amount of vegetables, meal planning and batch cooking. I forget that the best family bonding sometimes comes with paper plates and grilled cheese sandwiches. The time together is a time where we can learn to pray together and lift each other up. It is a place to come to know forgiveness both in the giving and receiving.

Jesus knew the value of a good family meal. He invites us all to his heavenly banquet each week. As Fr. Eric often reminds us, whenever we are at the table of the Lord we are home. I invite you all to our family dinner this week and pray it nourishes you in many ways.

Social Justice

The Safe Haven law, ARS 13-3623.01 now allows a parent or designated agent to anonymously relinquish an unharmed infant up to 30 days old, to a designated Safe Haven provider.

Recently, the Social Justice and Outreach core team and staff here at St. Patrick Catholic Community have had the opportunity to develop a relationship and receive training from an organization



called **Arizona Safe Baby Haven.** This is an organization that promotes education and awareness of the existing Safe Haven law in AZ to prevent the illegal abandonment of babies across the state. It also promotes safety and leaves options to sustain life. Our parish will now be an identified safe-haven location for a mother who can anonymously relinquish an unharmed newborn child *up to 30 days old* without fear of prosecution.

Staff received the training in July from CEO Heather Burner on what steps to take should a mother bring a child to the parish grounds who feel they are unable to properly care for their birth child rather than just abandon the baby. Rather than abandoning an infant, it gives the desperate mother options and resources while also giving a very strong chance for the child to survive.

The mother (or her agent) may choose to leave her information at which time she would be connected to an AZ Safe Baby Haven crisis response team. The team will connect with the mother and would help her navigate different options like temporary placement, foster care, adoption, or relinquishment.

Should the mother *choose not* to give any personal information and leave the premises, the child will be accepted, 9-1-1 would be called and the fire department would transport the child to the nearest hospital for assessment. The child will be cared for and eventually placed into a loving home.

The best way to help prevent a suicide-related crisis is to seek help and support before the crisis emerges. If you

or someone you love is experiencing thoughts of self-harm, it is essential to get mental health care as soon as the symptoms start; before reaching a crisis state.

Listen to them and accept their feelings. Be direct. Talk to them and make sure the environment is safe by removing any dangerous means of self harm.






