Stewardship

Would you say you have a mission in life? What motivates you to get out of bed in the morning? What drives you in your work, academics, family life, athletics, or activities? In your free time, where does your mind wander? What are you most passionate about?

People with a mission are driven. They wake with a sense of purpose and move throughout their day with intention. For some, it's to make money. For others, it's to make a name for themselves. Those with a heart, for the Lord, however, are the most dangerous because their mission is not self-seeking; it is kingdom seeking.

In the first reading, we see God calling Jonah to a mission. When Jonah obeys, the people of Nineveh repent immediately and cry out to God. In the gospel, we see Jesus, inviting the fisherman to a new mission. Their acceptance would mean the surrender of merely "making a living," exchanging it for the experience of truly living. They would then be inviting others to do the same.

Though omitted from the new American Bible translation (which you'll hear proclaimed at Mass), the original Greek text says the disciples left their nets immediately. That is the urgency that a mission-driven focus demands and elicits. It's that same urgency that St. Paul is preaching with (and about) in the second reading. Once you encounter the one, true God – Jesus Christ - who is the Way, you burn with the desire to follow him, echoing the psalm, "Teach me your ways, oh Lord."

The question is not whether God has a mission for us. Jesus' very name means "God is salvation." The question is whether you will respond to his invitation to join him on that mission, inviting others to join along the way.

Catholics who need to be Confirmed, THIS MESSAGE IS FOR YOU!

Have you been BAPTIZED but never **received your CONFIRMATION?** Now might be the right time to receive your final Sacrament of Initiation.

All you need to do is show up on January 27, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm with your baptism certificate, sponsor (if they can come), and your birth certificate. If you need a bit more time to get your Baptism Certificate or Birth Certificate, Dr. Lenny will work with you to get it done.

Dr. Lenny Kelley is doing a one-morning Sacrament of Confirmation workshop for all Baptized Catholics. I know many of you have been thinking about receiving your Confirmation for some time because you have told me. Now is your chance.

The Actual Confirmation will happen at the Easter Vigil (March 30) or when the Confirmation Mass is scheduled by the Diocese of Phoenix Bishop's office (TBD at this time).

What do you need to do to receive your Confirmation?

- 1. Register by emailing **lkelley@stpatcc.org** with the subject line reading "Adult Confirmation."
- 2. Get your baptism certificate from the parish where you were baptized.
- 3. Send your baptism certificate to **lkelley@stpatcc.org** or bring it with you on January 27.
- 4. Show up at the Easter Vigil or when the Bishop schedules Confirmations and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

~See a healthcare professional regularly. A woman should be sure to see her doctor when planning a pregnancy and start prenatal care as soon as she thinks that she is pregnant.

~Get 400 micrograms (mcg) of folic acid every day. ~Avoid harmful substances (alcohol, smoking cigarettes, marijuana and other drugs).

- ~Prevent infections wash hands often and especially after:
- Using the bathroom
- Touching raw meat, raw eggs, or unwashed vegetables
- Preparing food and eating
- Gardening or touching dirt or soil
- Handling pets
- Being around people who are sick
- · Getting saliva (spit) on your hands
- · Caring for and playing with children
- Changing diapers
- ~Avoid overheating and treat fever promptly.

Choose a healthy lifestyle. (Keep diabetes under control.






