Thank you, Lord, for your word. As no word in scripture is devoid of meaning, may your Word make clear to me the meaning of my own life. Please be with me today as I open my heart and mind to understanding you better through your holy Bible. Amen

Gold, frankincense, and myrrh- why not something the Holy Family could have used, like a horse or a donkey, some new tools for Joseph, or some baby clothes to replace the swaddling cloth? Why are we still talking about these gifts two thousand years later? Beyond their monetary value to the Holy Family, these gifts carry symbolic significance.

Pope Saint Gregory the Great viewed the three gifts in even more practical, spiritual terms for modern followers of Christ, saying "Gold is Christ's wisdom, which shines in us, frankincense is the prayer and adoration we give him, and the myrrh is our daily self-sacrifices."

In the first reading, we are told that the glory of the Lord (to come in the Messiah) will shine radiantly through the darkness (one might say, like gold). The psalm reminds us that "every nation on earth will adore you"; adoration and worship-like the use of (frank)incense - are liturgical and priestly acts. The second reading to the Ephesians speaks of "the mystery made known," which is precisely what we celebrate on Epiphany Sunday: the grand, revealing of God's mystery to the world. Still, what do these actions and gifts have to do with us in the twenty-first century?

If we want to live as modern Magi, we must put in the effort. We must go to where Jesus is (Holy Mass, sacraments, Word of God, adoration chapel). We must offer our God-given gifts back to him for his glory, not our own. We must worship him and him alone. Then, we must live lives that demonstrate the divine encounter, forever changed by the radiance pouring forth from the manger (tabernacle) at every Mass.

Catholics who need to be Confirmed. THIS MESSAGE IS FOR YOU!

Have you been BAPTIZED but never received your **CONFIRMATION?** Now might be the right time to receive your final Sacrament of Initiation.

All you need to do is show up on January 27, 2024, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm with your baptism certificate, sponsor (if they can come), and your birth certificate. If you need a bit more time to get your Baptism Certificate or Birth Certificate, Dr. Lenny will work with you to get it done.

Dr. Lenny Kelley is doing a one-morning Sacrament of Confirmation workshop for all Baptized Catholics. I know many of you have been thinking about receiving your Confirmation for some time because you have told me. Now is your chance.

The Actual Confirmation will happen at the Easter Vigil (March 30) or when the Confirmation Mass is scheduled by the Diocese of Phoenix Bishop's office (TBD at this time).

What do you need to do to receive your Confirmation?

- 1. Register by emailing **lkelley@stpatcc.org** with the subject line reading "Adult Confirmation."
- 2. Get your baptism certificate from the parish where you were baptized.
- 3. Send your baptism certificate to **lkelley@stpatcc.org** or bring it with you on January 27.
- Show up at the Easter Vigil or when the Bishop 4. schedules Confirmations and receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.





Benefits of Donating Blood!

Gratification

A single blood donation can save up to three lives

Your Heart Will Thank You

Regularly donating blood may improve your heart health. Donating reduces the thickness of your blood, allowing it to flow more easily through your body and reach your heart faster. A study, published in the American Journal of Epidemiology, found that people who donated blood had an 88% lower risk of suffering a heart attack.

You May Skip the Gym

A study by the University of San Diego found that donating one pint of blood "burns" between 600 and 650 calories. Calories are burned when the body expends energy to replace red blood cells that were removed.

You Can Be Part of a Greater Community People who frequently donate often develop friendships with the center staff and their fellow donors, who are all committed to helping save lives.

You May Reduce Your Cancer Risk A study published in the Journal of the National Cancer Institute found that donating blood may reduce the amount of iron people have in their bodies. You need iron to live, but too much can increase your chances of getting cancer. Frequent blood donors had lower risks of liver, lung, colon, stomach, and throat cancer.

It's important to note that these findings don't apply to everyone. Check with your doctor about your iron levels and donating blood.


