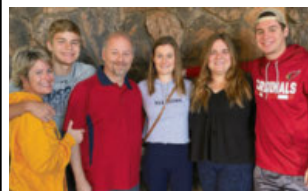

Dear Friends,

When someone attends Mass at St. Patrick, one notices when the announcements are done at Mass. Some parishes do announcements traditionally at the end of Mass, others might do them right before the Mass begins.

So I have asked myself this question, what are the announcements and what do they try to accomplish?

In the time of Jesus, there was a posture that a disciple might have, staff in hand, ready to take the message out to the world. The word "Mass" means to "be sent." When one leaves the grounds at St. Patrick, one can read the sign that says to go and "live the Mass." All these words remind us of the response to what we heard at each Mass. So when we gather, we hear the Word of God proclaimed, and it is broken open by the homily, so the announcements are shared when everyone is fully present right in the middle of Mass. It makes so much sense then to ask the question, what are we to do? Go and live the Mass!

The announcements are done right after the homily. All are present, there is a call to form community which cares for each person, makes others feel they belong. Other messages are helping people in the greater community. Churches/Parishes that serve people outside their walls are places of life. Not my sole opinion, but many studies on churches state this. So at St. Patrick, one hears the Word of God, hears it presented in an inviting way, then one is told these are some of the ways to live out our discipleship.

One last point is every parish has people who leave early, it is just a fact of life. They might never hear any announcements with very little chance to be moved to serve others in some community way. That is why when everyone hears the announcements, everyone has a chance to say "yes" to serving and living discipleship.

As Paul Harvey used to say, "and now you know the rest of the story." Good Day.

Stewardship

The story of the healing of the man born blind invites us to consider the importance of sight, both physical and spiritual. The blind man is given physical sight, but he is also granted spiritual insight about the person of Jesus. Through Baptism, we are called to walk as children of the light, to live in full knowledge of who Jesus is for us.

When infants are baptized, parents, with the help of the godparents, assume responsibility for raising the child as a follower of Jesus. The process of maturation in the faith is much like the example found in the story of the man born blind. The man is cured of his blindness, a symbol of his sin. Each time he meets someone after the healing, the man comes to a deeper awareness of who Jesus is. In a similar way, we who are baptized continue to mature in faith as our relationship with and knowledge about Jesus grows.

Have you grown in your faith this Lenten season? If you have, "GREAT!" Continue down your path of growth, relationship and knowledge. If your first answer is "not so much," know you are not alone. We are all bombarded with so much stimulation that it is easy for us to miss what is right in front of our eyes.

This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that Jesus helps us see what is truly important in life. Our God allows us to "reset" and start again/nor. He is merciful and gracious and loves you for who you are and where you are in your faith journey! Consider taking time to get to know Jesus today. No matter where you are on your path take a moment this week and reflect on what you find most important in your life. Do you make time for that important (fill in the blank) in your busy life? What can you do to refocus the rest of Lent? How can you grow closer to Jesus?

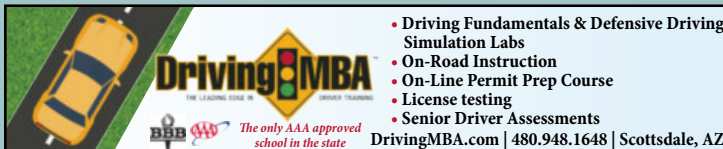

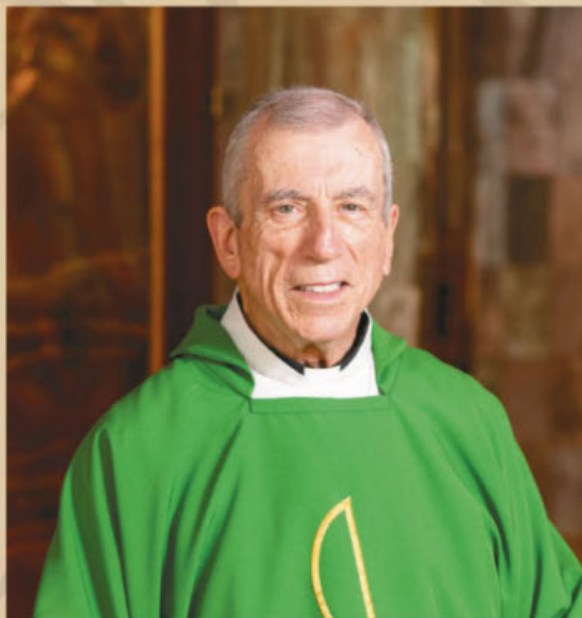

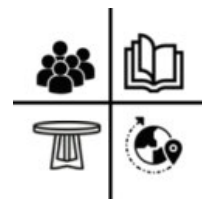

Prayer

Father,
help us to be like Christ your Son,
who loved the world and died for our salvation. Inspire
us by His love, guide us by His example, who lives
and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for

Commentary

1st Reading: Ezekiel 37:12-14

As we approach the season of Easter, we
take time this weekend to reflect on the
promise of immortality.

The Prophet Ezekiel presents an awesome picture of
graves opening up and the dead rising from them.

The promise is for a restored Israel where all people will
"Know God." We read:

"I will put my spirit in you that you may live, and I will
settle you upon your land; thus shall you KNOW that I
am the Lord."

As Christians, we speak of a new Israel (a new Jerusalem)
which is heaven. Heaven is more than a place. Instead, it
is a state of being - of being one with God. To "Know
God" is to be one with God.

True life - even before we die and are raised to heaven - is
to know and live with God. As Christians, we live when
we live for God!

Question

How am I living with God now?
How am I living for God now?

Commentary

2nd Reading: Romans 8:8-11

A question from an old Catholic Catechism goes like this:

Q: Why did God make you?

*A: God made me to know Him, to love Him, and to serve
Him in this world, and to be happy with
Him for ever in heaven.*

This is our purpose! We live to live for
God. In fact, if we don't live for God, then
we don't live. Our life has no purpose here
or in the world hereafter.

If we are honest, we know that we can fall
short in our desire to live for God.

Thankfully, as St. Paul reminds us in our Second
Reading, we have the Holy Spirit who lives for God in us.

The Holy Spirit is God and the Spirit finds a dwelling place
in us making it possible for us to live for God. St. Paul
writes:

"Whoever does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong
to him."

Thankfully, this Spirit has been planted within us to live for
God - to know Him, love Him, to serve Him, and to be
happy with Him for ever in heaven.

Question

How has the Spirit of Christ moved me to know, love, and
serve God?

Commentary

Gospel: John 11:1-45

Our Gospel today invites us to be restored to God in Christ.

Lazarus, the brother of Martha and Mary, is resuscitated from death. The resuscitated life of Lazarus is symbolic for a restored life with God.

It is Christ who gives us the Spirit of life and restores us so that we can live - live for God!

Christ gives us this restored life here and now; not just on the last day! He says to Martha:

"I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die."

Now, in this story, Lazarus is resuscitated. Resuscitation is not resurrection. Eventually, Lazarus would die and be raised from the dead. However, this Gospel story today is a foretaste of the real Resurrection account of Jesus on Easter.

One day, we will all be raised from the dead and, if we live for God, we will be raised to Eternal Life. However, this does require that we respond to the Spirit of life within us who calls us to live for God here and now.

God chooses to restore us to life. Our life only has meaning if we live for God!

Question

Martha was asked by Jesus if she believed. How do I express my belief that Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life?

This Week's Task

In Lent, we have an opportunity to be restored to life in Christ through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is a perfect way to prepare for Easter and renew our Baptismal commitment to Christ, the Spring of living water, who washes away our sins.

Group Prayer

In preparation for Reconciliation before Easter, the leader invites the group to make a brief examination of conscience in silence. Then, the leader invites the community to say the Confiteor:

I confess to almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned through my own fault, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and what I have failed to do; and I ask blessed Mary, ever virgin, all the angels and saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

The leader invites the gathering to pray the psalm for the 5th Sunday of Lent.

Psalm 23

Psalm

Response: With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.

Out of the depths I cry to you, O LORD;
LORD, hear my voice!
Let your ears be attentive
to my voice in supplication.

R: With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.

If you, O LORD, mark iniquities,
LORD, who can stand?
But with you is forgiveness,
that you may be revered.

R: With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.

I trust in the LORD;
my soul trusts in his word.
More than sentinels wait for the dawn,
let Israel wait for the LORD.

R: With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.

For with the LORD is kindness
and with him is plenteous redemption;
And he will redeem Israel
from all their iniquities.

R: With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.

Social Justice

General Jeannie (Flynn) Leavitt, United States Air Force

Breaking through established societal gender barriers is something that can be a challenge, especially for a female entering into a job position historically dominated by males. Jeannie Leavitt is **one woman who** not only attempted to break through these gender



barriers, she also embraced the aspect of breaking sound barriers by becoming the first United States Air Force female fighter pilot when she stepped into a F-15E Strike Eagle in 1993. She then went on to become the first woman to command a USAF combat fighter wing. She is now General Jeannie Leavitt.

Born in St Louis, Missouri in 1967, Jeannie (Flynn) Leavitt learned a lot about the USAF from her father who was also a member of this branch of military service. She attended Catholic schools before moving on to the University of Texas where she studied and received a BS in Aerospace Engineering before moving onto Stanford University for her Masters in Aeronautics and Astronautics. She began her formal undergraduate flight training in 1992 in the Air Force and in 1993 she began her formal combat training to become a fighter pilot.

Jeannie has a long list of accomplishments, including the highly prestigious title of principal military assistant to the Secretary of Defense in Washington, DC in 2014. She also completed over 300 combat flight hours in Afghanistan and Iraq. In 2016, she became the first woman to take control of the 57th Wing at Nellis Air Force Base and was promoted to **Brigadier General. Between 2002-2010, Jeannie earned three more masters degrees: a Masters in Business Administration from Auburn University, Masters of Military Operations of Art and Science, and a Masters in National Security Strategy.**

She has proven herself to be an inspiring leader for many women who seek to contribute their skills and talents to the wider world. In her personal life, General Leavitt is married to a retired Air Force Colonel Craig Leavitt and they have two children. She has been with the USAF for 30+ years.

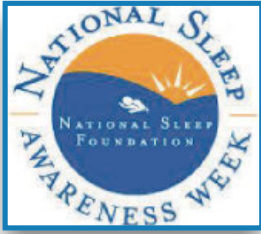

Sleep is essential to every process in the body, affecting our physical and mental functioning the next day, our ability to fight disease and develop immunity, and our metabolism and chronic disease risk. Sleep is truly interdisciplinary because it touches every aspect of health.*

Seven simple tips to help you get a better night's sleep:

1. Get enough ZZZ's – an average of seven or eight hours of sleep for adults. Infants and children need more sleep.
2. Go to bed and wake up at about the same time each day.
3. No viewing technology before bedtime. The blue component of light suppresses melatonin which regulates sleep.
4. Have a relaxing routine before bedtime. Take a bubble bath, read, or listen to quiet music.
5. Keep the bedroom at a cool, comfortable temperature.
6. Avoid alcohol, caffeine, spicy and fried foods right before bedtime.
7. Exercise regularly.

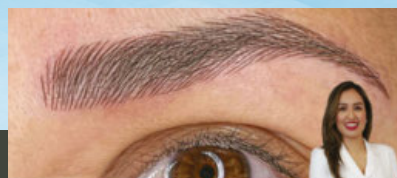

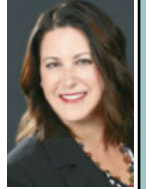
