

Dear Friends,

One of the most beautiful things about Easter Sunday is how the many houses of God are filled with his people. Resurrection still touches the hearts of people and reminds us that the ones we have lost through death are welcomed into God's Kingdom and one day we shall see them again. You will notice a very large candle near the altar during the 50 days of Easter called the "Paschal Candle." In Hebrew "Paschal" means Passover and we believe that Jesus passed over from death to life. At our baptism we receive a candle lit from the Paschal Candle to remind us that we will share in a death like Jesus and we will also share in his Resurrection.

At St. Patrick one notices the round altar, reminding us that the table is accessible from every side. It is at the center of our entire sacred space. The altar belongs to the baptized, all of us. Underneath our altar are three angels holding up the table of the Lord. These angels represent that, at the same time we eat the heavenly bread, all the people who have gone before us eat the same bread at the heavenly banquet. We are connected to the people who have died, we have not lost them. The Church in Heaven is connected with us, the Church on earth. This is exactly what our faith teaches and believes. Even though Easter Sunday is a big day for many people, the Church offers 50 days of Easter celebration! So the flowers will remain, the Paschal Candle remains in front, and we hear of the Resurrection appearances of Jesus. What a great reminder that 40 days of Lent leads us to 50 days of Easter where we celebrate well these sacred mysteries.

As you read this, please remember you never lose your place at the table of the Lord. The Lord invites us to eat and then live the Gospel of Jesus Christ out in the world. I hope that those who have been away from the table will consider eating the bread of life together in community and with those who have died and gone to the heavenly banquet. We have not lost our loved ones who have gone home to the Lord.

Happy Easter everyone and blessings on these 50 days of Easter!

Our Pillars

We hope that everyone will find these principles alive at St. Patrick. These five foundational areas, or pillars, are emphasized in all we do at St. Patrick.

LITURGY

We are committed to celebrating the sacraments well. The Second Vatican Council documents on liturgy clearly speak of full, active, and conscious participation in the liturgy, not mere spectatorship.

HOSPITALITY

We are challenged by our faith in Christ to acknowledge the presence of the person; to be inclusive in our attitude toward every person, and to be aware of the dignity of every person.

SOCIAL JUSTICE

We reach out in relationship with those we assist. This can then lead to systemic change and "right" justice. With God as the priority in our lives, concern for our neighbor's lack of basic needs is our mission. However, our response should not simply be one of charity. Our parish commits both energy and resources to bring about justice in response to what the Church teaches for Gospel living.

FORMATION

We are formed and shaped in the image of Jesus Christ. From the smallest child, to preschool, elementary, middle school, or high school youth, up to the most mature adult, formation is to be first and foremost the transformation of one's heart and mind to know Jesus Christ and live in that relationship. It is through this journey that we can learn the doctrine of our Catholic faith.

STEWARDSHIP

We are stewards, and as Christians we realize that what we have does not belong to us, but to God. Eighty times in the New Testament the word "steward" or "stewardship" is used; a reminder for us to be careful stewards of all that we have been given. This way of life needs to be the core of what we claim to be.

Baptism - Break - Renew



I was at the edge of the river where water was lapping over my shoes. I was trying to get a good angle to take a picture. Father Bob was out in the middle of the Jordan dressed in a long white alb and over knee deep in the water. There were dozens of baptisms going on all around him. Every once in a while he would kick or shake his leg. When he later came out of the water, I asked why he was shaking his leg. He told me that there were

small fish nipping at his ankles.

So when John the Baptist was in that very same river with Jesus hundreds of years ago, were there little fishes also? Probably. So many people have entered a new state of grace in that river. They found a way of regeneration. Without realizing it "the face of the earth is renewed"! Renewal was the theme for the day. Later, Maggie and I would be just West of the Jordan in the town of Canaan where dozens of couples renewed their wedding promises.

But from Baptism to Renewal there is something. There is what I call the "Break!" For the most part it is a very soft, subtle thing, symbolizing purification or regeneration. But what an interesting thing is this word "break."

We "break" bread. We have breakfast. To rest, we take a "break". After a long hot spell, the temperature drops and there is a "break" in the weather. Someone seems to have no luck so they say "they can't catch a "break". Waves "break" on the rocky shore. A detective says, "It was a nice "break" in the case. A dejected love thinks "break" my heart. When we play a game of pool, we "break" the triangle formation of balls and the balls scatter all over the table. So in all of these "breaks" we go from one condition to another.

During the recent funeral of Queen Elizabeth there was one ritual that showed the Lord Chamberlain holding up what is referred to as the Queen's Wand or Queen's Stick. The Lord Chamberlain held the Stick above his head and snapped the stick in half. It is called the "Breaking of the Queen's Stick." The pieces are then placed on the coffin of the Queen. This is to indicate that the Ruler is gone and the Lord Chamberlain is no longer in that position. A new Ruler will pick a new Lord Chamberlain.

So, in Baptism we go from one state to another, from one condition to a new condition. The "break" is not even noticed. It is so smooth and soft and embracing. In Baptism, it is renewing and SENDING us on our Way!

TAKE A WHITE CANDLE AND PRESS IN 5 RED TACKS IN THE FORM OF A CROSS (SYMBOLIC OF THE WOUNDS OF CHRIST). LIGHT THE CANDLE. FAMILY MEMBERS TAKE TURNS HOLDING THE CANDLE & SHARING HOW THEY HOPE THE LIGHT OF CHRIST WILL LEAD THEM. TAKE TIME TO PRAY FOR ONE ANOTHER.

TAKE AN EMMAUS WALK:

BEFORE YOU START OUT, READ THE EMMAUS STORY (LK 24: 13-35) TOGETHER. THEN GO TO SOME PLACE THAT HAS SPECIAL MEANING TO YOUR FAMILY, OR TO SOME PLACE WHERE YOU HAVEN'T GONE FOR A WHILE. IMAGINE THAT IESUS IS WALKING WITH YOU.

THE TOASTING BRUNCH:

MOST OF THE GREAT DRINKING TOASTS FROM AROUND THE WORLD ARE MADE TO CELEBRATE LIFE AND HEALTH. TAKE TURNS PROPOSING TOASTS TO ONE ANOTHER, LIFTING YOUR GLASSES IN CELEBRATION. VIDEO CHAT YOUR FRIENDS AND RELATIVES WHO ARE OUT OF TOWN AND DO THE SAME!

An Easter Prayer Journal

Enster Vigil Gospel: Luke 24:1-12

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb. And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, approached, rolled back the stone, and sat upon it. His appearance was like lightning and his clothing was white as snow. The guards were shaken with fear of him and became like dead men. Then the angel said to the women in reply, "Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him.' Behold, I have told you." Then they went away quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed, and ran to announce this to his disciples. And behold, Jesus met them on their way and greeted them. They approached, embraced his feet, and did him homage. Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me."

Commentary

The two women return to the tomb most likely anticipating that they will find the crucified body of Jesus. But instead they encounter an angel, a sign that God is at work. The earth shakes as a sign that things will never be the same. The angel sits on the stone as if to indicate that tombs going forward will forever remain open for they no longer have a purpose. The frightened women then twice receive a command that all of us are supposed to hear: Stop being afraid! God has defeated death. In the resurrection there is no place for fear, only joy. Go forth and spread the good news.

Stewardship 9PS GIVING | PRAYING | SERVING

During Lent we were invited to reflect on the Paschal Mystery by our Lenten sacrifices of almsgiving, prayer, and fasting. Now we are invited to reflect on Jesus' Resurrection and the gift of eternal life that he gives to us.

Today we begin the Easter Season, our 50-day meditation on the mystery of Christ's Resurrection. In the Easter Gospel we hear about how the disciples found the tomb empty three days after Jesus' death. We are also told that they do not yet understand the Scriptures or that Jesus had been raised from the dead.

That understanding gradually unfolded for the disciples as they began to experience the risen Lord. Similarly, our understanding of Jesus' Resurrection unfolds for us throughout our lives. Thus, the details provided are not necessarily meant to offer proof of the Resurrection. The details invite us to reflect upon a most amazing gift, that is faith in Jesus and his Resurrection.

In the weeks ahead, we will hear how the first disciples moved from confusion, doubt, and skepticism to faith. Their experience can teach us how we too might receive this gift of faith from God.


