





# **Social Justice**

# **Affordable Housing**

The Arizona Department of Housing (ADOH) is the conduit for funding new supportive and affordable housing in our state. Over the past 25 years ADOH has



funded more than 50,000 housing units throughout Arizona, with more than 3,500 currently under construction. The sources of ADOH's funding includes federal and state Low Income Tax Credits, federal HOME funds, federal Community Development Block Grants, the federal and state Housing Trust Funds, and since the pandemic, American Rescue Plan (ARP) funds including State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds.

Since 2021 the Agency has been designated by the Governor as the point agency for homelessness as well, bringing together homeless-to-housing resources of various state agencies: the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS); Arizona Department of Economic Security; Arizona Department of Health Services; Arizona Department of Corrections; and Arizona Department of Veterans Services. As part of this process, these agencies meet every other week with homeless and healthcare providers to share information, community challenges and financial resources. The results of these ongoing meetings have been to identify immediate needs, better leverage private and public funding, and improve communications between sister agencies and those we serve.

Since the COVID pandemic began, Governor Ducey has announced more than \$240 million in grants and funds aimed at assisting the homeless as well as keeping people in their current homes. One ongoing need being addressed is to help find "reentry housing" for those leaving prison. There are thousands of individuals who can't even begin the process of rebuilding their lives due to the extreme housing shortage in Arizona. An excellent example of creatively meeting this need for reentry housing is Hickman Farms in far west Maricopa County. In order to meet the need for workers, the Hickman Family built housing for those leaving prison who choose to work for Hickman Farms. With no local, state or federal assistance, the Hickman family has sparked a new model for reentry housing, one which we at ADOH hope we can build upon over the next 24 months using our federal and state funding resources.

Our mission is to house Arizona residents and provide the resources to non-profit organizations to meet that need. With current funding and a new collective effort, Arizona is moving the needle in the right direction.

This bulletin article was composed by Director Tom Simplot, Arizona Department of Housing, who is a strong advocate for ensuring that programs are established to create, preserve, and invest in affordable housing statewide.

# Know the Warning Signs...

Talking or writing about killing themselves; withdrawing from friends and family.

Giving away prized possessions. Increasing alcohol and drug use. Drastic change in behavior– may change from angry to calm.

Listen to them and accept their feelings. Be direct and talk to them.

# Five L's of Lendership...Pank Hillebrand

A couple of weeks ago I had the privilege of leading our annual Ministry Leaders, Finance council, and our Staff Retreat Day here at St. Patrick.

It was a great opportunity to see cherished friends and ministers here at St. Parick and also meet some new people who have heard the call and are getting involved here at St. Patrick.

Our Theme for the day was *Called to Lead* and I lead the first part with some reflections on leadership and on our individual call to ministry. Fr. Eric led the second half of the day laying out our new theme for the coming year; Gather, Proclaim, Break, Send.

I was trying to research leadership and what are the top qualities of a leader and man, are there some great suggestions on the Internet! I decided to come up with my own from what I read, and I thought I would share them with the rest of the parish. So since I was talking about leadership, I decided to make the Five L's of Leadership.




