





Dear Friends,

This week is very sacred for Christians as we call this week, Holy Week. Christians remember Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection, and a term we use to describe these events is Paschal Mystery. Paschal means "passover" and we remember Christ passed over from death to life.

The invitation is to gather together for what is called, TRIDUUM, a word meaning three days. This Thursday is called Holy Thursday when we remember the Last Supper, washing of the feet, and adoration after Mass until midnight. Mass begins at 6:30 pm. Good Friday is the day we mark as Christ's death, a day where there is

no Mass in the entire world. Stations of the Cross are at noon and the evening service for Good Friday is at 6:30 pm. Holy Saturday we will have the Easter Vigil begin at 6:30 pm. It is the most beautiful Mass of the year with baptisms, confirmation, and Eucharist for those being welcomed into our faith. Remember this Mass is longer, so be aware when deciding to attend an Easter Vigil anywhere. New Easter Mass times on Sunday are 8:15 am, 10:45 am, and 12:30 pm. These times should help with traffic flow and parking situation.

This Wednesday, we will have the last opportunity for the sacrament of reconciliation/confession with eight priests from 6:00 - 8:00 pm in the church.

I invite everyone to be sure to make this week different than any other week of the entire year. Make it sacred by attending a holy week service, extra prayer time at home, or a sacred place. Maybe plan to do something that can serve others by prayer, visiting, reaching out, or being present to others.

I will see you this coming Sunday for Easter.

Palm Sunday: A Lesson in Mercy

Over the past few weeks of Lent our readings have been guiding us to the hill of Calvary where we see the fulfillment of God's love for us on the cross. On Palm Sunday we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We hear about the crowds that gathered around and praised Jesus. They laid down their cloaks and laid palm branches at his feet singing "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord". They have all seen and heard about the many miracles he performed, from giving sight to the blind man to the raising of Lazarus from the dead. Yet as we know this praise and celebration of Jesus quickly turns to betrayal and mockery as he is led to the cross.

As we arrive at Palm Sunday, we hear the familiar narration of the Lord's Passion. I think sometimes the story can almost seem too familiar and our attention begins to waver. I remember when I was growing up my parish would do the narration and the congregation would play the part of the crowd in the narrative. I remember reading the lines of the crowd,... "Crucify him, crucify him". It always made me uncomfortable and a bit sad. Here was Jesus, who I was told loved me and who would always be there in my life, and yet here I was saying "crucify him". It made me so uncomfortable, and it was even hard for me to read those lines. I didn't want to be someone

who denied Jesus, yet I also knew I was a sinner.

It is amazing to see how quickly the crowd turns on Jesus. What a difference there is from palms and flowers to the crown of thorns that pierced his head. But think about how commonly in our own lives we follow a similar path. We come to mass and welcome Jesus into our life then a few days later we forget about him and fall into sin. Hearing the passion of Christ always makes me confront the reality that I am a sinner, and that isn't a pleasant thing to do. And yet I think the Passion of Christ should make us a bit uncomfortable, but the Passion should also inspire us as we see the love and mercy of Christ for us. The beauty of the Passion is the constancy of Jesus' love and fidelity. The crowd turns on Jesus, Judas betrays him, Peter denies him, yet Jesus endures it all and dies on the cross for our sake. We hear him say, "Forgive them, for they know not what they do". Love, compassion, and forgiveness; those are at the center of the Passion. We should never lose sight of that.

BLESSING OF THE EASTER BASKETS

on Saturday, April 19 at 11:00 am

Outside the main entrance to the church.

History and Tradition:

Święconka, meaning "the blessing of the Easter baskets," is one of the most enduring and beloved Polish traditions on Holy Saturday. While originally observed by Polish people in the U.S., it has grown in popularity.



The tradition is said to date from the 7th century in its basic form, the more modern form containing bread and eggs (symbols of resurrection and Christ) are said to date from the 12th century.

Baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white linen or lace napkin and decorated with sprigs of

boxwood, the typical Easter evergreen. Poles take special pride in preparing a decorative and tasteful basket with crisp linens, occasionally embroidered for the occasion, and boxwood and ribbon woven through the handle. Observing the creativity of other parishioners is one of the special joys of the event.

The foods in the baskets have a symbolic meaning:

- * Eggs symbolize life and Christ's resurrection
- * Bread symbolic of Jesus
- * Lamb represents Christ
- * Salt represents purification
- * Horseradish symbolic of the bitter sacrifice of Christ
- * Ham symbolic of great joy and abundance.

The food blessed in the church remains untouched until Sunday morning.

Please remember to bring your basket to be blessed.




