Dear Friends,

It is my joy to hear all the first confessions of our 2nd graders in our Reconciliation preparation. We gather about 10 families at a time during Lent for a ceremony and confessions. When welcoming the families, I always remind the parents that the goal for that evening is simply to ensure their child has a good experience. Not making them fearful for not doing it correctly, forgetting their prayers or simply being so scared. I feel it is my responsibility to make sure each child has the best experience possible, and I have been doing this for many years.

What a joy to hear the comments from the children saying it was not bad, or saying that it was easy, or skipping when they head to the family car. Parents are relieved when the children make it through the ceremony.

So what happens when children grow up and it can become a very unpleasant experience? God's mercy is to be celebrated as Luke's Gospel says, "there will be more joy over one repentant sinner." Why is confession for some, not the best experience? There are many reasons I am sure, but I am asking people to remember we have some good priests available for confessions before Easter. The Crosiers, a religious order that helps us, and a couple of retired priests will be available for confessions. This Wednesday, April 9 from 6:00 - 7:30 pm there will be five priests available for confessions. The last opportunity will be the following Wednesday, April 16 from 6:00 - 8:00 pm (we will go longer if needed). There will be eight priests available for confessions. I would encourage parishioners to choose the earlier one if possible so that the wait is not as long.

When the Triduum (three days of Holy Week) begins on Thursday, April 17, all our focus should be on those three days so confessions should be completed on that last Wednesday.

I pray your experience of this great sacrament will be just as good as our 2nd graders. The goal is always to make sure every person has the best experience possible in celebrating God's mercy.

Christian Disciples in Mission Living Beyond Sunday

Lent: A Journey Together in Hope and Solidarity

In his Lenten message this year, Pope Francis reflects on what it means to "journey together in hope." First, "to journey" calls to mind the journey of the people of Israel to the Promised Land. Pope Francis points out that we cannot help but "also think of those brothers and sisters who in our own day are fleeing situations of misery and violence in search of a better life for themselves and their loved ones." The reality is we are all pilgrims in this life. As a Lenten exercise Pope Francis encourages us to compare our daily life with that of some migrant or foreigner, to learn to sympathize with their experiences and in this way discover what God is asking of us.

Second, he speaks of what it means to journey "together." The Church is called to walk together, side-by-side with one another and never as lone travelers. "The Holy Spirit impels us not to remain self-absorbed, but to leave ourselves behind and keep walking towards God and our brothers and sisters." Journeying together means walking side-by-side without envy or without letting anyone be left behind or excluded. We are called to be attentive to one another in love and patience. This is a reminder of our own theme, "will others see Christ in

me?" It raises the question amid our divisions, how are we cultivating a unity grounded in our common human dignity? How are we walking together with others, listening to them, resisting the temptation to become self-absorbed and to think only of our own needs?

Finally, Pope Francis speaks on hope which is the central theme of this Jubilee year. As we draw closer to Easter we recall the hope we find in Christ through his death and resurrection. "Death has been transformed into triumph, and the faith and great hope of Christians rests in this: the resurrection of Christ." Do we trust in the promise of eternal life, do we believe the Lord can forgive our sins? Hope is the anchor of our faith, especially when we are lost or undergoing difficulties. This lent, let us remember this important message from Pope Francis as we journey together in hope and solidarity.



Child Abuse Prevention and Catholic Social Teaching: A Call to Protect the Vulnerable

Child abuse is a serious violation of human dignity, and Catholic Social Teaching (CST) provides clear guidance on how to address this issue. CST emphasizes the inherent worth of every person, especially children, and calls for their protection. Every child deserves to be treated with respect, care, and safety. CST teaches that society has a responsibility to protect the most vulnerable, and children, due to their dependency, require special care. The church advocates for creating environments where children can thrive, free from abuse and neglect. This includes supporting families and addressing issues like poverty that contribute to abuse.

Through principles like subsidiarity and solidarity, CST calls communities to act together, both in preventing abuse and supporting victims. Catholics are urged to foster a culture of care, justice, and accountability, ensuring all children are protected from harm. In this way, child abuse prevention becomes not only a societal duty but a moral call rooted in the values of Catholic Social Teaching.




