Christian Disciples in Mission Living Beyond Sunday

Following the feast of the Assumption, this week we celebrate the feast of the Queenship of Mary on August 22. Drawing from Scripture and tradition, Mary is given the title of Queen. In the book of Revelation, we see the image of a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of twelve stars on her head. Her crown signifies her queenship. Her title is also given to her based on her role as Theotokos (Mother of God). As Christ is King, so his mother is granted the title of Queen. In his encyclical, Ad Caeli Reginam, Pope Pius XII said, "the Blessed Virgin Mary should be called Queen, not only because of her Divine Motherhood, but also because God has willed her to have an exceptional role in the work of our eternal salvation." Mary participates in the salvation of mankind and thus shares in the royal dignity of her son as Redeemer and King. St. John Damascene wrote, "when she became Mother of the Creator, she truly became Queen of every creature."

In modern times, the significance of queenship has faded, often associated with mere ceremony. But in ancient kingdoms, the queen held a place of dignity and influence. The queen would sit beside the king as he judged the people brought to him. The queen would intercede for the people before the king. In a similar way that is the role of Mary as our queen and mother, she intercedes on our behalf before God. She turns her maternal heart towards us and being concerned for our eternal salvation, she intercedes for us.

On this feast day we recognize the intimacy and closeness of Mary as our mother and queen. It was at the foot of the cross where Jesus gave us his mother as he told his beloved disciple "Behold your Mother." Her role as our mother is familiar for many of us, but her role as a queen of heaven and earth may not be as well understood. Some may think calling Mary the queen of heaven and earth somehow takes away from the royal power of Jesus. Mary shares in the royal authority of Jesus just as she shared in the salvific act of Jesus at the end of her life being assumed into heaven.

Everything we say about Mary flows from what we know and believe about Jesus Christ. In reality we are all called to share in the royal dignity of Jesus. When we are baptized we become members of Christ and partake in his royalty. In fact, St. Peter says we all share in the royal dignity of Jesus. In his first letter St. Peter says, "you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation" (1 Peter 2:9). It is up to us to live up to the royal dignity and priesthood that we were baptized into.
