Dear Friends,

Our past listening sessions revealed that the role of women in the Church is an important item to look at. A staff member recently shared at a meeting that out of all our Lay Ministers who lead ministries at St. Patrick (approximately 130 ministries) 70 percent of the lay leaders are women. I was taken by that great news. I hope many find that women have an important role to serve the people of God here at St. Patrick. Next Sunday, September 3 is the Feast Day of St. Phoebe. She is mentioned briefly in St. Paul's letter to the Romans (16:1-2). There is thought that she delivered Paul's letter to the Romans. St. Paul speaks of Phoebe

with warmth, praise and generous words. She was from the Church in Cenchreae (port in Greece near Corinth) and she most likely traveled from Greece to Rome to deliver that letter. What a commitment to the ways of Christ she must have had. She is mentioned as "minister" and in some translations "deaconess" even though it is not clear exactly what the responsibilities were at that time. Paul does use the word benefactor (helper) to describe her.

Next Sunday our parish will honor her feast day by remembering the critical roles women have had and do have in our Church. We will be in unison with at least 150 parishes across the country who will celebrate this feast and ask a woman to offer a reflection at our Masses.

I look forward to honoring this Feast day and all that it entails for our Church.

Celebrating Women in our Church

Several years ago, we hosted a series of synod listening sessions here at our parish and a key theme that emerged was women's participation in the Church.

The weekend of September 3, **St. Patrick Catholic Community will join 100+ parishes in celebrating St. Phoebe's feast day.**

In Romans 16:1-2, St. Paul says, "I commend to you Phoebe our sister, who is also a minister of the church at Cenchreae, that you may receive her in the Lord in a manner worthy of the holy ones, and help her in whatever she may need from you, for she has been a benefactor to many and to me as well."

Paul goes on to highlight the roles many women took on to support the early Church. St. Phoebe was a woman of great courage and deep love. She answered God's call to minister to God's people during the earliest days of the Church when persecution against Christians was strong. She earned the trust of Paul, who depended on her to handle communications with the ecclesial community in Rome.

By participating in September's global witness commemorating St. Phoebe, our community will celebrate the gifts of women in our own community. We join our hearts in prayer for the Global Synod as our Church discerns women's roles.

Stewardship

Lord God, King of Heaven and Earth, thank you for the gift of St. Peter. Thank you for giving us such a humble and honest leader to guide the Church, your holy bride, to your heavenly banquet. Teach me, today, to honor the authority you left to the popes. May I offer my prayers much faster than I offer my criticism. Amen.

A driver's license represents far more than just the legal ability to operate a motor vehicle. A license is a privilege, a responsibility, and an implied promise to obey the laws of the road. As important as it is, however, it can't start a car — you need keys for that. By extension, while the license is a symbol of what you can and will do, the keys are a symbol of freedom, maturity, and authority.

As Catholics, we know well the story of Jesus giving Simon "the keys" to the Church, changing his name to Peter and promising that hell would never vanquish us. What few people know, however, is something revealed to us in the first reading this week from Isaiah. This practice of giving the keys to the prime minister has its roots in the Old Testament. Here we see Eliakim, the prime minister, being given a robe and sash along with a key to demonstrate his authority. He controls the lock which both keeps intruders out and inhabitants safely in. Note, too, that earlier in the passage we hear that although Eliakim is a leader, God says, "I will call my servant."

St. Paul is so overwhelmed by God's creativity and promise to save the world through Christ, he has to write about it — which he does in this second reading. The psalmist, too, praises God for His mercy, fidelity, and kindness. What we see in the institution of Peter as our first pope is a plan that God had in the making centuries and centuries prior. We see God acknowledging our need for a servant leader to bring order to the earthly chaos, to govern us with a heart for God, and to provide His Church — His kingdom on Earth — a firm foundation of truth and mercy upon which to be built. Those keys have been passed through an unbroken chain — a key-chain — century after century, ensuring that all have a chance to come to experience God's mercy through His Church here on Earth.



HOSPITALITY HAS MANY FACES...INCLUDING UNDERSTANDING DISABILITY, RELATED ISSUES AND LANGUAGE

Thanks to the ADA of 1990 (Americans with Disabilities Act), parking and other accommodations are now far more available to those in need. At St. Patrick we have many disabled parking spots and each marking has a unique message.

Here are some requirements around disabled parking allowing parishioners in need every opportunity for accessible parking and enjoying St. Patrick Hospitality.



The vertical stripes have a reason and are important. Never park on the lines - even a little bit. Those lines are for the benefit of someone who needs space to lower a ramp, a wheelchair or walker. If they cannot do this task, they are unable to leave or enter their vehicle. They miss Mass or other events on campus.

If you can use a parking spot **WITHOUT STRIPES**, please consider doing so, leaving the larger spots with stripes for people with mobility aids. Also, those lines are NOT for motorcycles (or shopping carts at the market!!).

If you do not have a disabled license plate, please be sure to display the parking hang tag from your mirror.

If we all understand and appreciate the need and use for disabled/accessible parking, we grow our radical hospitality.

Social Justice

Allowing oneself to be transformed by the plight of others is one element of the Justice foot of our Catholic faith. In order to do this we must first allow the Holy Spirit into our hearts and minds so the process of transformation can begin. Many wonder how to initiate this.



This Fall 2023, we will again offer the

Just Faith faith formation classes here at St. Patrick. The topics to choose from will be Hunger, Migration, or Racial Inequity. The criteria to get involved is simple. Just choose a class session, sign up for it, and show up with an open heart and mind willing to learn.

Just Faith modules consist of eight sessions plus one immersion experience. Sessions meet for two hours, once a week. Led by a facilitator, these sessions are designed so that you become a small faith community group which will study your chosen social topic together. Through readings, discussions, videos, prayer, and fellowship you will be brought closer in learning what the gospel looks like in everyday life.

On the face of it, the Justice foot of our faith does not seem as "visible" as our charity foot. Yet, one foot cannot walk without the other. It brings balance. The Justice equation involves behind-the-scenes work within ourselves. You are invited to this Justice formation that will effectively enhance and nurture relationship. The relationship of understanding the plight of others. Justice involves advocating and educating oneself on social topics in order to become a voice that speaks for those who cannot speak for themselves. But how can one do that if we don't even recognize what that plight is or even looks like for others?

Let **Just Faith** open that door of transformation for you. You will have two options at the end of your sessions: First, walk away and say to yourself that you learned a lot. Second, walk away knowing you now have a deeper knowledge but will be transformed enough to discern next steps toward Charity and Justice. Chances are, you will choose the second option.


