Grief Support Ministry

The unexpected death of a loved one can be one of the most difficult and challenging times in life. Everyone deals with grief in a variety of different ways and although the first year is often the hardest, the grieving process often lasts years. Losing someone close to you, whether a spouse, sibling, parent or child, can bring up feelings of isolation, confusion, sadness and disconnection from others. Experiencing the death of a loved one can feel overwhelming and you may even feel like no one understands or knows what you are going through. With the help of grief support you can see that you are not alone. At St. Patrick, our Grief Support Group is an ongoing, Christ-centered faith sharing group for those who need consolation and support after losing a loved one. Ministries like grief support can offer individuals a renewed sense of hope while journeying through the grieving process. Grief support provides a framework for understanding grief, validates feelings and experiences, provides a sense of hope, and connects individuals with helpful resources. After the death of a loved one many can feel lost or simply just overwhelmed with emotions. Ministries like grief support offer an outlet to both process emotions and strengthen your spiritual life.

In scripture St. Paul reminds us, because we are Christians we do not grieve like the rest of the world. As Christians we have a reason to hope because we know that death is not the end. We have hope even in the face of death, because Jesus has already won the victory over sin and death itself. We all face unexpected loss in life, how we handle that loss is up to us. As Christ reminds us

and as our faith shows us, we are not alone, we are united as a community of faith as part of the Body of Christ.

If you have recently experienced the loss of a loved one, or are still struggling with the loss of a loved one I would encourage you to pray about being a part of the grief support ministry. Groups currently meet on Mondays and Tuesdays and are open to anyone who has experienced loss. Currently we have a need for facilitators to help guide one of the support groups. You do not need any prior experience to help facilitate, you simply need a caring heart for those who are grieving. Although it may seem intimidating, ministers will be provided all the training necessary to help facilitate the support group. I invite you to pray about being a part of this important ministry if that is where God is pulling your heart. 



Nurses Corner

BABY HEALTH

Tips from the American Academy of Pediatrics to reduce the risk of SIDS-sleep-related infant death.

- The baby should sleep on a firm, flat non-inclined surface.
- Sitting devices, such as car seats, strollers, swings, infant carriers, and infant slings, are not recommended for routine sleep for infants younger than four months.
- Breastfeeding reduces the risk of sleep-related infant deaths, and while any human milk feeding is more protective than none, two months of feeding at least partial human milk has demonstrated to significantly lower the risk of sleep-related deaths.
- Parents may sleep in the same room but not in the same bed as a baby.
- Avoid parent and infant exposure to nicotine, alcohol, marijuana, opioids, and illicit drugs.
- Make sure the baby receives routine immunizations.
- Pacifier use is associated with reducing risk.
- Avoid the use of commercial devices that claim to reduce the risk of SIDS or other sleep-related deaths.
 There is no evidence that any of these devices reduce the risk of these deaths.
- Supervised, awake tummy time is recommended to facilitate infant development. Parents are encouraged to place the infant in tummy time while awake and supervised for short periods of time beginning soon after hospital discharge, increasing incrementally to at least 15 to 30 minutes total daily by 7 weeks of age.




