



# **Cancer Related Fatigue: There is Hope!**

Cancer-related fatigue (CRF, sometimes simply called "cancer fatigue") is one of the most common side effects of cancer and its treatments. Many people feel physically, emotionally and mentally exhausted most of the time, but there is hope!

Taylor Fitzgerald, a Physical Therapist at Honor Health, will offer different options that may help relieve some of the symptoms of CRF, including:

# PARISH VERIFICATION INFORMATION



from the Diocese Catholic Schools Office

For parents registering their children for the 2023-2024 school year, please note: In order to receive the school's reduced Catholic Tuition Rate, your pastor must determine whether your family meets the criteria set by your parish for Registered, Active, Participating members. The definition of registered, active and participating varies by parish, but usually includes attending Mass regularly as well as contributing online or with an envelope to the offertory along with participating in the ministry life of the parish. If you have questions about your family's status, please contact the Parish Office.

Note: All Diocesan high school students receiving the reduced tuition rate for the coming year must have their status verified by their home pastor.

For St. Patrick Catholic Community Parish School Verification, parishioners must be registered, active and participating members for a minimum of six months prior to submitting their form for verification. For further requirements, please contact Torri Winn at twinn@stpatcc.org.

# **Social Justice**

Labor Trafficking is a sub-category of human trafficking

that many face because of vulnerable situations. Many are migrants who are seeking a better quality of life due to poverty, famine, war, and economic instability. Those traffickers



that prey upon them take advantage of their undocumented status because they know that victims are too afraid of authority figures to report any illicit behavior or practices brought upon them. "A study of 554 labor trafficking cases over a ten-year period found tactics such as restriction of movement, withholding of documents, use of threats to family members, and physical/sexual abuse were common means of controlling the victim" (ASU School of Social Work, Gnaedig, Kaleff, & Newlon, 2019).

It is not uncommon for an individual, who agreed to be smuggled in order to seek a better life, to then be a victim of a "bait and switch" deception scheme. Promises are made that employment with a fair wage with housing is set and waiting for the person. Everything instantly gets changed and they are sent to work for an employer with unfair practices and/or unhealthy working conditions. They are made to feel that they need to pay additional "fees" now that they are in the U.S. This is known as debt bondage.

Smuggling has now turned into trafficking. Pay is withheld, documentation or ID is confiscated so they cannot identify themselves, and threats are made to the person or their families. Most are not aware of any labor laws. There are no workman's rights should one get injured on the job, which means no paycheck either. This causes a person to work while injured which perpetuates into negative health issues. Isolation becomes prevalent because of language barriers, lack of knowledge of surrounding areas, or having no socialization outlets.

What can we do? Educating ourselves is the first step. Watch in this week's Connection for a link composed by the ASU School of Social Work. Also, look at personal consumer habits. It is difficult to track the supply chain to the end-user most times, yet there are some websites that can help: Shop Ethical (ethical.org.au), The Art of Simple (theartofsimple.net), and Free World (slaveryfootprint.org).






