Pope Francis: Fratelli Tutti, on Fraternity and Social Friendship

Pope Francis recently signed his latest encyclical, titled Fratelli Tutti, which focuses on spiritual unity through social friendship and the importance of caring for our neighbors. In it, he discusses how the coronavirus pandemic has exposed the "throw-away culture" which denies the dignity of those who are vulnerable within our global systems. Fratelli Tutti is a call to love one another as brothers and sisters; it is a call for fraternity beyond borders; to engage with each other in positive and meaningful ways, as we are all children of God. To quote Pope Francis directly, "The signs of the times clearly show that human fraternity and care of creation form the only path to integral development and peace..."









Stewardship

In today's Gospel passage from Luke, we read the well-known parable of the Good Samaritan. Here, Jesus teaches us in rich detail what stewardship in action looks like. In fact, this parable could just as accurately be called the parable of the Good Steward.

The first thing we note about the Good Samaritan is that he is aware of the needs of those around him and responds generously. While the priest and Levi brush right past the man on the side of the road, the Samaritan is watching for those who might be in need. He has a hospitable way of looking at the world around him and so he is able to "see" in a way that the others did not, and he was "moved with compassion at the sight" of the man.

Next, we see the Good Samaritan spring into action to serve this man, setting aside his own schedule and plans to meet his needs. He does not just give the man a few dollars or offer quick words of encouragement from across the road. He goes right up to the man. He cleans and bandages his wounds. He puts the man on his own animal and brings him to an inn where he can heal. He ensures the innkeeper would continue to look after him, and he commits to returning to the man on his way back.

That is how we live out God's commandments. That is true hospitality and service. That is how a good steward springs into action when he comes upon a neighbor in need. And Jesus says to each of us personally, just as He did in today's Gospel, "Go and do likewise."





from the Diocese Catholic Schools Office

For parents registering their children for the 2022-2023 school year, please note: In order to receive the school's reduced Catholic Tuition Rate, your pastor must determine whether your family meets the criteria set by your parish for Registered, Active, **Participating members.** The definition of registered, active and participating varies by parish, but usually includes attending Mass regularly as well as contributing online or with an envelope to the offertory along with participating in the ministry life of the parish. If you have questions about your family's status, please contact the Parish Office.

Note: All Diocesan high school students receiving the reduced tuition rate for the coming year must have their status verified by their home pastor before they can be registered as Catholic.

For St. Patrick Catholic Community Parish School Verification, parishioners must be registered, active and participating members for a minimum of six months prior to submitting their form for verification. For further requirements, please contact Torri Winn at twinn@stpatcc.org.



PLEASE NO CRAYONS OR GLUES this year due to the heat.



Social Justice

Struggles of Having an Incarcerated Parent

"Not knowing how long your parent has until you see them again. Anything can happen in prison, they can get killed or hurt really bad. When you see your mom or dad, you look at them like it's your last visit. That's something I feel."



During our **Back to School Event** this month at St. Patrick, the Children of the Incarcerated are those who we support through our Prison Ministry in association with the diocese. In the past, parishioners have donated \$25 gift cards from Walmart and Target and we are kindly asking for this participation again. (Please see the bulletin flyer for details). These are children who need our parish support with their basic needs to ensure they are ready for the school year.

Who are the Children of the Incarcerated?

A listening session was held to give children the opportunity to have a voice in sharing their stories and experiences. There are many common themes that were brought forward and this is what the children who spoke would like us to know about them:

"The toughest thing [about my father's incarceration] is seeing my mom struggle with money."

"You become mentally incarcerated with your parent."

"It's hard when you have no one to talk to."

Many of the youth have been exposed to addiction, abuse, and violence so the gift of an education is the first step for them to have any chance at taking strides to distance themselves from these situations. For others, there are missed opportunities of building a healthy relationship with the parent. Shared milestone events like graduations, birthdays, and holidays don't occur. Many of their families struggle with finances due to lack of income and they are forced to help raise siblings rather than participate in social or sporting activities. There is also the trauma of watching a parent being arrested and removed which adds to their adverse childhood experiences.

We thank you in advance for your prayers and generosity which helps support our annual **Back to School Event** here at our parish.

Nurses Corner

WEST NILE VIRUS

During monsoon season there can be an increase in the number of mosquitos



FACTS

Cause: Bite from infected mosquito

Symptoms: Appears two to six days after being bitten.

Symptoms include: headache, body aches, joint pains, vomiting, diarrhea, or rash. The majority recover but may experience fatigue and weakness for an extended period of time. It can be a serious illness for some: over 60 years old or with certain medical conditions.

PREVENTION

Empty, drain or cove<u>r</u>sources of standing water around your home to prevent mosquito breeding.

Wear long-sleeves, long pants, and socks when you go outdoors. When outdoors, use insect repellant containing DEET.

When using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first and then apply mosquito repellent.

Do not apply repellent onto hands, eyes, mouth, and cuts or irritated skin.

Dress your child in clothing that covers arms and legs.

For children older than two months, use insect repellent on exposed skin. Adults should spray insect repellent on their hands and then apply to a child's face.

Cover crib, stroller, and baby carriers with mosquito netting.

Products containing oil of lemon eucalyptus or para-Menthane-diol should not be used on children youger than three years old.

Ordinary Time...by Nic Cortez

One time in a dream, I was walking along the side of the road in the middle of the desert. I'd no recollection of why I was walking there, but I could see a town up ahead and maybe half a mile to the right. It seemed somewhat ordinary for a small town, but the closer I got to it the more I could see cars driving to and from it, and people moving every which way between the buildings. I decided to head towards the town in the hope of getting out of the heat of the late morning sun for a bit.

Shortly before entering the town, I noticed a large sign flanked by a few prickly pear cacti. The sign read "Welcome to Ordinalis." Interesting name for a town. Continuing on, I began walking on the sidewalk of what seemed to be the main street, lined with row after row of businesses, restaurants, and cafes. I took a look inside the windows of a few of the businesses to see what I could learn about this town. In one window, there appeared to be rows of students taking notes at desks listening intently to an instructor writing on a whiteboard. In another window, a group of people keenly listening to a man in an apron giving instruction on how to bake bread. Next was a workshop, where a mechanic seemed to be giving detailed instructions on how to repair a car engine to a swarm of attentive individuals. Shop after shop, it seemed that at each one, a group of people were there to learn a trade or a skill.

I stopped over at a nearby restaurant, sneaked past a waiter teaching a gathering of bright-eyed young people how to carry a tray of drinks without spilling them, and went over to sit at the bar and asked for a glass of water.

I asked the bartender, "What kind of town is this? It seems like everywhere I look, people are studying to learn one skill or another."

Placing a glass of water before me, the bartender replied, "Welcome to Ordinalis, friend. That name, it's Latin for "order," and a fitting name it is for a town like ours. Here in our town, we try to set a rhythm of growth so that people can be the best versions of themselves and work together with each other. We encourage people to visit each business one by one and learn a new skill every week."

"That's an interesting model for a town," I said. "But surely you don't expect people to fully digest those skills in just a week!"

"No, sir. Some skills can take a lifetime to fully set in. But the classes are offered the same way every year, so students can keep learning until it sets in and becomes natural for them." "I see." I thought for a moment. "And the town itself is run by those who have reached a professional level then?"

"It's not just the professionals," answered the bartender. "The best way for people to learn and grow is by doing. So it's customary here for people to work alongside the professionals to hone their skills."

"Sounds like a pretty good way for people to grow. Does everyone take the classes?" I asked.

The bartender responded while wiping a glass, "No, not everyone. No one is forced to take the classes. Everyone has their own choice of what they want to do with their lives. Some leave the town, others stay, but don't involve themselves in much. Some avoid them at first, but eventually they come around."

Suddenly the bartender looked up at me with a playful but piercing gaze. "So why did you come to this town?" And then I woke up.






