






SYNOD LISTENING SESSION FOLLOW UP - YES, THERE IS FOLLOW UP!

Stewardship

In today's Gospel passage from Luke, we find our Lord appointing disciples to go out and prepare others to receive His invitation into the Kingdom of God. Every verse has something to say about the way a Christian steward should approach others. Let's consider at least one of the coaching tips Christ gives.

"The Lord appointed seventy-two others whom He sent out ahead of Him in pairs to every town and places He intended to visit." In His wisdom, Christ sent His disciples out not as individuals but in pairs, as teams. This approach to evangelization certainly provided practical advantages. The disciples could lean on each other for mutual support and encouragement, helping each other to stay on task and to put their heads together to pray and problem-solve. This teamwork approach is just as relevant to us modern-day Christian stewards. It takes courage and commitment to go out and invite others into the Christian life. We need to work together to do it well.

But there is also symbolic importance to working in teams. It points to the reality that when we invite others to embrace the Good News of the Gospel, we are not merely inviting them into a belief system, but into a relationship with Christ and through that relationship, into Christ's family — our fellow Christian disciples near and far.

Our parish is our immediate spiritual family in this extended worldwide fold. We are not meant to live as isolated individuals within the parish any more than we are meant to live in isolation within our families. We are meant to be a community. That is why it is so important for us to foster a vibrant, supportive, welcoming parish life. This is why we emphasize hospitality as one of the pillars of stewardship. It is not enough just to point others to Christ; we must invite them to join us in community with Him; we must offer a place and mission for them in the Church and within our parish family.

from the Diocese Catholic Schools Office

For parents registering their children for the 2022-2023 school year, please note: In order to receive the school's reduced Catholic Tuition Rate, your pastor must determine whether your family meets the criteria set by your parish for **Registered**, **Active**, **Participating members**. The definition of registered, active and participating varies by parish, but usually includes attending Mass regularly as well as contributing online or with an envelope to the offertory along with participating in the ministry life of the parish. If you have questions about your family's status, please contact the Parish Office.


Note: All Diocesan high school students receiving the reduced tuition rate for the coming year must have their status verified by their home pastor before they can be registered as Catholic.



Social Justice

One of the most important factors in helping a child to develop is a successful school experience that lays the foundation for their development of socialization skills, relationship building, and academic knowledge to help them advance.



A child faces a certain amount of trauma and confusion when a parent is incarcerated. There is also the embarrassing stigma at school they may face from their peers.

Because of this, they may begin to feel a deeper sense of isolation and disruption in their daily lives. It is not uncommon for a parent to be housed hundreds of miles away and the child has no control whether anyone will take them to see their parent.

Over the next few weeks leading up to our *Back to School Supply and Gift Card Drive* this month, please take this time to pray for these children who are experiencing the loss of a parent in the form of incarceration. Remember them and their parents in your daily prayers.

As a part of this event, in addition to the regular school supplies, we will also be collecting \$25 gift cards from either Walmart or Target specifically for the Children of the Incarcerated. These children and their families are then visited by staff from the Diocese of Phoenix Prison Ministry who share our gifts and prayers with them from our St. Patrick parish community. This will help them kick off the school year in a positive direction.

It is the hope that we all can assist them with their school needs so they may encounter the living Christ in their day to day activities, social life and the familial experiences that create their individual realities. Nurses Corner

HYDRATION

Arizona summers are HOT, causing heat-related illnesses to be common from May through September. Living in a warm climate causes increased sweat and bodily fluid loss.

Your body keeps cool by letting heat escape through skin, by evaporating sweat (perspiration).

Dehydration occurs when there isn't enough water to replace what's lost.

Beware: Thirst isn't always a reliable gauge of dehydration!

A better indicator is the color of your urine: Light-colored urine means good hydration. Dark yellow urine usually signals dehydration. Other signs of dehydration include: increased thirst, low urine output, dry mouth, increased fatigue, or dizziness and fainting.

The usual recommendation is to drink six to eight eight-ounce glasses of water daily. Health, age, activity level, and climate will change this equation.

Don't always like to drink water? Add fruits and vegetables that have high water content – salad, watermelon, and squash.

Be alert to your fluid intake and increase it as needed this summer.

Travel Light...with Richard Dicarlo

"Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals."

Not exactly the words of encouragement one wants to hear before setting out on a journey. Being sent on a mission with no itinerary or material goods to sustain you along the way. Rely on the kindness of strangers to welcome you, feed you, and shelter you. A bit frightening, especially the "sending you like lambs among wolves" tidbit! Who knows what time of year it was. Extreme heat or cold? Rainy or sunny?

Thieves along the way, perhaps? I guess that's the flip side and advantage of what we would call "traveling light". Nothing to steal here!! I panic if I forget my toothbrush at home...

The reality, though, is that this is what many face even today in our community on a day-to-day basis. Traveling light is not an option, because it is actually a day-to-day existence for many who have so little to begin with. Lack of options (or choices) is one of the defining elements of poverty. Other than the monetary aspect, this lack-of-option poverty manifests itself in many forms like lack of



decent healthcare (medical or dental), having to make decisions on whether to get a car fixed, pay for rent, or cut back on food for the week, or living in a crime-infested neighborhood because they can't afford to move. Having to drive miles to obtain clean drinking water.

When I reflect upon this gospel, there are four things on our faith journey that Jesus is asking of us all in the context of traveling light so we can step closer towards understanding the term solidarity:

- 1) Shed complacency and make room for the awareness and knowledge to realize there are many who quietly suffer through daily burdens.
- 2) It asks us to unload our unnecessary emotional baggage of judgment. Judgment inhibits us from moving towards areas of compassion or service.
- 3) Empty ourselves of the unnecessary material abundance we gather and hoard. Pause, look around, and ask what could be done without. Share.
- 4) And finally, Faith. Faith in knowing that we have an abundance of talent and gifts to share with others on this journey God is sending us on.


