We received a lovely thank you card from St. Vincent de Paul thanking our Vacation Bible School (VBS) for the TONS of coffee kits we made for their guests. The coffee kits were made on Tuesday of VBS, while in service with Megan and Sara. The kits are a snack size ziploc with a packet of coffee creamer, sugar, a napkin, coffee stirrer and a note with the St. VdeP services/resources that are available. These kits are handed out each morning when they distribute coffee to those on the streets. I estimate we made around 800-850 coffee kits that day.

Stewardship

Today's Gospel passage comes as a pat on the back from Heaven for all of us striving to live a stewardship way of life. It reminds us why we live the way we do and why we make the choices we make. Let's face it, if we truly embrace this way of life, there will be people who find our choices — based on serving God and others — downright foolish. But let's see what God thinks. Spoiler alert: turns out Christian stewards are not the fools!

In this passage, Jesus makes it clear that life is not about "stuff" as he tells the parable of the wealthy businessman who thought he had everything figured out. The man had such an abundance of stuff that he didn't have room to store it all. So, thinking of earthly things and not on what is above, he decided to build a bigger place to store all that stuff. Patting himself on the back, he thought about what good times he would have in the years ahead. But Jesus tells us that day would turn out to be the man's last day on the earth. And he had spent it thinking only of himself. How foolish!

Don't be ashamed of living differently from the people around you. Be confident as you set priorities based on what is above. You are wise in God's eyes, Christian steward. And you will be rich in what matters most.

For parents registering their children for the 2022-2023 school year, please note: In order to receive the school's reduced Catholic Tuition Rate, your pastor must determine whether your family meets the criteria set by your parish for Registered, Active, **Participating members.** The definition of registered, active and participating varies by parish, but usually includes attending Mass regularly as well as contributing online or with an envelope to the offertory along with participating in the ministry life of the parish. If you have questions about your family's status, please contact the Parish Office.

Note: All Diocesan high school students receiving the reduced tuition rate for the coming year must have their status verified by their home pastor before they can be registered as Catholic.

For St. Patrick Catholic Community Parish School Verification, parishioners must be registered, active and participating members for a minimum of six months prior to submitting their form for verification. For further requirements, please contact Torri Winn at twinn@stpatcc.org.





Social Justice

Today, July 31, is the feast day of St. Ignatius of Loyola who was a Spanish priest and theologian who founded the Jesuit order in 1534. Known for its missionary, educational, and charitable works, the Jesuit order also is dedicated to the foot of justice in social ministry. St. Ignatius Loyola's Spiritual Exercises takes a holistic view of the world. The three main elements are Experience, Reflection, and Action.

The motto of the Jesuits is "Ad Majorem Dei Gloriam" (AMDG) meaning "for the greater glory of God". St. Ignatius encouraged the practice of seeing God in all things and being "men and women for others". Service to others and inner reflection completes the whole self. Thus, the Daily Examen is a practice still commonly used to help us slow down and allows time to speak to God and give thanks.

Nurses Corner

What happens if you get sunburn - what could you do?

July is **UV** Safety Month.

Near pool or lake - take a few seconds to dip in the water, cover up and get out of the sun. Then use cool compresses or very short cool shower.

While skin is damp apply a gentle moisturizing

lotion. Reapply for the next couple of days.

Decrease inflammation. If it is safe for you to do so, take ibuprofen, naproxen or aspirin. Use over-the-counter 1% cortisone cream as directed. Aloe Vera may help. Wear loose clothing to avoid skin irritation and stay out of the sun entirely until the sunburn heals.

Stay hydrated while burn heals.

For adults and children: See a doctor if you have severe blistering over a large part of your body, have fever and chills or are confused. Do not pop blisters which could lead to infection.

Children:

Bathe in clear, tepid water.

Less than 1 year old, sunburn should be treated as an emergency. Call your doctor immediately.

For a child 1 year or older, call your doctor if there is severe pain, blistering, lethargy or a fever 101 degrees F or higher.

Sunburn can cause dehydration. Give your child water or juice. Contact the doctor if the child is not urinating regularly; this is an emergency.

Apply light moisturizing lotion to soothe the skin, but don't rub it in. Dabbing on plain calamine lotion may help, but don't use one with an added antihistamine.

Do not apply alcohol, which can over-cool the skin.

Do not use any medicated cream such as hydrocortisone or benzocaine unless a doctor prescribes it.

Keep your child out of the sun entirely until the sunburn heals.

Important note: Babies under six months of age should never be exposed to the sun. Babies older than six months should be protected from the sun, and should wear UV-blocking sunglasses to protect their eyes.

Four only true treasure is the treasure you give away...by Brian Cannon

Luke 12:13-21, which is sometimes called the Parable of the Rich Fool, warns us against material prosperity's false sense of security. Lately we've been having some pretty big storms out in our neck of the woods in Gilbert. One particular storm hit with no notice bringing torrential rain and high winds. In a moment, huge 30-year-old trees were toppling on people's houses and cars. There was absolutely nothing to do, except watch the trash cans blown by the wind race each other down the street and wait for the storm to pass. Stuff can always be taken away. Treasures can be depleted with a dip in the market caused by real or imagined fears and speculation about the future. So long as those things remain the center of our lives we will live in a constant tension between lusting after more and being terrified of losing what we have. That's really no way to live.

"There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?'
And he said, 'This is what I shall do:
I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones.
There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!"
But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

What matters to God? The gospel values are treasures that increase as they are given.

Understanding.

Love.

The more you spend, the more you have.




