I like to remind all parishioners that they may sign up for our weekly Email Connection to the parish community. Sent every Thursday, we offer the latest information regarding parish activities and services available to those who might need them. The information is timely and helps prepare for the upcoming Sunday events. Please go to our parish website and click on the "Communications" tab of our menu to view past Connections and to sign up for the weekly email. This email is the most effective way we can communicate with the community. We send it out to over 5,400 email addresses and our statistics tell us that over 66% of the emails

we send are opened and read. That is a very high open rate number! Typically, the average open rate for email campaigns varies by industry and target audience, but a good open rate is generally considered to be between 17–28%. Government emails tend to have the highest open rate at 29%, followed by hobbies-related industries like photography, writing, and art at 28%, and religious emails at 27%. So our 66% open rate is amazing!

We remind everyone that the St. Patrick YouTube Channel has the Sunday Mass and other videos to view. The Parish's Facebook page is still followed by many people. One example is Fr. Stephan's video of leading the Vacation Bible School kids in the music motions. It had over 2,500 views. Instagram is also used by our parish.

If you are traveling, remember that you can view our Sunday Mass on the YouTube channel to stay connected with us.

To be a Child: A Lesson in Faith

In scripture when the disciples ask who is the greatest in heaven, Jesus calls a child over and says, "Truly, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 18:3). It may seem odd, but Jesus is pointing us to a lesson we can all learn from children. If we are striving to go to heaven then our faith should reflect that of a child's. The faith of a child is marked by humility, trust, love, and joy. Like children we must strive to be innocent in the way we see others not giving in to prejudice and bias. We must allow ourselves to be inspired and filled with awe by the works of God. As adults we can learn alot from children. The question is does our faith have the same level of trust, humility, and joy as a child?

Three weeks ago we had another very successful Vacation Bible School. For a week the campus was transformed into a fun and safe space for over 300 children and 100 ministers. With the theme, "Jesus is a game changer," children walked in the footsteps of St. Peter learning how Jesus can transform our lives. Each day was packed with engaging activities, and inspiring lessons, from interactive Bible stories to creative crafts, energetic games, and uplifting music. Of course this was only possible thanks to the hard work of staff, ministers, and families who dedicated their time to support this important ministry.

Working with children can be a transformative experience. They often teach us more than we expect and can show us how we are called to live a life of joy. As Jesus reminds us, if we want to get to heaven we have a lot to learn from the children around us. Pope Francis also challenges us saying, "May we always care for our children, not counting the cost, so that they may never believe themselves

to be mistakes, but always know their infinite worth." It is up to us to support and care for the children of this community and to help nurture their spiritual growth. Here at St. Patrick we are still looking for ministers to help work with children's formation for the coming year. Stewardship

God our Father; you are all-powerful. You can calm any and every storm that torments our lives and hearts. Quiet the storms this day, we humbly pray, that are causing us the most worry and anxiety. Help us to be still. Help us to trust that you not only care but also are here with us, beside us, and we need not worry. Come and rescue us, once again, Lord. Amen.

It's natural for our human minds and hearts to wonder and even wander when we hit stormy seas in life. It doesn't make us horrible; it merely makes us human. This week's readings are a stark reminder, however, that even when we can't see through the storm at sea, God's hand is firmly upon the rudder, guiding us to shore...eventually.

In the first reading, God offers a wake-up call of sorts to poor Job. The Creator reminds his creation that he is bigger than not only the storm, but also the doubts that arise within it. In the same way, this week's psalm reminds us of God's great power and might, able to calm any waves that threatened to crash over us. St. Paul reminds the church in Corinth, again, that Christ not only died for us but also rose for us. That fact alone ought to give us pause and hope amid any suffering: we know the final score, and he will not forsake us. These readings are a fitting preamble to this gospel passage, where Christ is sleeping in the stern. The disciples, presume Jesus is ambivalent when they ask, "Do you not care that we are perishing?"

How often in our lives, do we doubt God's love or trust in his care, when he does not answer our prayers according to our plan, we may even think he is asleep or not paying attention. In this brief but dramatic scene, Christ reminds us that God is near enough to call upon within the storm and his mercy is unrivaled. He wants what is for our good and, ultimately, for our salvation. Our call is to trust in his presence, his plan, and his willingness to act according to his timetable and not our own.

Social Justice


The recently published Point-In-Time Homeless Count is an annual street and shelter count that determines the number of people experiencing homelessness in Maricopa County during a given point in time. Conducted on a single day in January (this year it was January 28), this project is a snapshot which assists in identifying the needs and characteristics of those experiencing homelessness. Every Continuum of Care board is required to submit PIT Count results to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as part of a national effort to identify the extent of homelessness across the country.

As you look at the graph of the Maricopa County results, you will see a number corresponding to the terms sheltered and unsheltered.

Think of the term unsheltered as a person who does not have any type of sustainable structure over their heads. It is a living space that is not meant for human habitation. This may consist of an abandoned building, a car, a tent, public park, sidewalk, or a desert wash for example.

The term sheltered generally refers to a more sustainable structure, designed as a temporary place, but it provides better protection from the outdoor elements and exposure. This can be an emergency shelter, transitional housing, or a safe haven facility for example. Both of these terms are used for those experiencing homelessness. They are not permanent housing options.


