Christian Disciples in Mission Living Beyond Sunday

The Scrutinies

Have you ever heard of the Scrutinies? Chances are, you have probably seen them before on a Sunday during Lent but maybe you never really understood what was happening or the significance of it. The Scrutinies may sound like an agonizing experience, but in the Catholic Church it refers to the rites during Lent that serve as a way of assessing one's readiness for baptism. There are three Scrutinies that occur during Lent. The Gospels on these three Sundays are meant to teach the Elect about the mystery of sin and the Spirit of Christ which frees us from sin. It is a reminder that Christ alone is the source of healing and life. Through the Scrutinies we are reminded that in baptism, we are given life-giving water that truly satisfies, we are given new eyes of faith, and we are given new life.

During the Mass "the Elect" (those preparing to be baptized at Easter) are called forth to the altar. These participants in the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, OCIA, are called to deepen their faith through catechesis in preparation for the Sacraments of Initiation. At the beginning of Lent, catechumens are elected by the Bishop for the Easter sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist. The scrutinies are meant to remind the Elect, and all of us, that we are sinners, and we need the saving grace of God. They are meant to strengthen and heal the Elect on their journey to full communion with the Church. Part of the scrutinies is a prayer for freedom and protection from the effects of sin and from any influence of the devil, this is referred to as a "minor exorcism". This season of preparation can be a difficult time which is why as a Church, and as a community of faith, we help to support the Elect with our prayers.

The Scrutinies are described by the Church as "rites for self-searching and repentance, which are meant to uncover, then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the Elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good. The Scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the Elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the Elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all." At its core, the scrutinies are not about the sinfulness of the Elect, but about the overwhelming grace of God in Christ.

As we observe these Sundays of Lent, let us keep the members of OCIA in our prayers. Lent is a perfect time to examine (scrutinize) the areas of our lives where we sin both in what we do and what we fail to do. How is God calling you right now to live out your faith? Let us remember the truth of the scrutinies: we are all sinners in need of healing and forgiveness; we all need the salvation offered to us by Jesus.
