Stewardship

Carousels are really exciting ... for children. When you're a kid the carousel seems huge and exhilarating. You don't mind the monotony of the circle you're "riding" or the redundancy of the rising and falling motion. It's not until you become older and more mature that you see the carousel for what it is: safe and predictable. The roller coaster, on the other hand, is exhilarating and "dangerous." That shoulder harness and/or lap bar is the only thing holding you down and you know it.

Now, which of these rides most directly resembles your faith life: the carousel or the roller coaster? Is your faith predictable or dangerous?

A life led by the Holy Spirit is exciting and "unsafe." As we see in the first reading, the apostles are on the verge of changing the world — all they are lacking is the power of God. Christians can and will renew the face of the Earth (Psalm 104:30), as the Psalm says, and they have for centuries, wherever the Spirit has been allowed to work through them.

The Lord equips His Church with gifts (second reading), authority (Gospel), and power (first reading) so that all would come to know God's love and mercy. Some believers opt for the safety and predictability of a carousel relationship with God, where they never truly surrender control. Pentecost invites us to jump in the roller coaster car held together only by God's Love (who we call the Holy Spirit), to throw our hands in the air, and scream with joy each day of this great adventure we call life until He calls us home to heaven.

What will you do differently this week to get on that roller coaster of faith?

Hear our prayer this day and in your mercy answer us in the name of all that is holy.





Do you have an empathetic heart and truly care for people going through tough times? If so, then Stephen's ministry might be the right ministry for you!

Stephen's Ministry provides high-quality, one-to-one, Christ-centered care to people in the parish and community experiencing difficult times.

Stephen Ministers are parish members trained by their Stephen Leaders to offer care to people who are hurting. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with that person once a week for about an hour.

Care receivers are individuals in the parish or community who are going through a crisis or life difficulty. Potential care receivers first meet with a Stephen Leader, who assesses their needs for care and matches them with a Stephen Minister. The caring relationship lasts for as long as the need persists.




