St. Martin of Tours: An Example of Compassion

On Monday, November 11 the Church celebrates the feast day of St. Martin of Tours. Martin was born in 316 in what is now Hungary. In 313, just before Martin was born, Christianity was legalized ending years of bloody persecution. Martin's father was a pagan military official in the Roman army which led to young Martin being enlisted at the age of 15 to discourage him from pursuing any interest in the Catholic faith. But even service in the military did not discourage Martin as he strove to live a humble and upright life giving much of his pay to the poor.

As a soldier, Martin encountered an unclothed beggar standing in the cold. While the other soldiers passed by, Martin stopped and cut his own cloak into two halves with his sword giving half to the freezing beggar. Later that night Martin had a vision of Christ appearing to him wearing half the cloak he had given to the poor man. Jesus declared, "Martin, a catechumen, has clothed me with his garment." Martin knew it was time for him to join the Church and be baptized. After being released from the military, Martin followed a new path as a soldier of Christ. Martin fully dedicated his life to following Christ and became known for the love and compassion he showed others.

St. Martin provides us with a great example of what it means to show compassion to a person in need. As Catholics we should all strive to emulate the same compassion and love that

St. Martin showed the cold beggar. This example of compassion is something we here at St. Patrick hope to model to the community and to the world.

This year I ask you to pray about participating in our Bags of Compassion Advent Mission. Consider donating items, or giving financially to support our mission to bring a little more compassion into the world. Our goal is to gather items and assemble 4,000 bags on December 9, which will be dispersed by parishioners to people experiencing homelessness in our community during the Christmas season.

It can be easy to overlook a person in need. Just think of how many times we drive past someone on the street asking for help. We can all embrace our theme by taking the time to "look twice" at a person in need. May we follow the compassionate example of St. Martin by

sharing the blessings God has given us with those in need.
