Dear Friends,

On the first Sunday of November we heard from the Gospel of Mark, Chapter 12. Jesus is asked an honest question from a scribe who asks which is the greatest commandment? Jesus answers with the commandment to love God. Every Jew recited what is called the Shema, to love God with our whole heart. Jesus adds another commandment, which is to love our neighbor.

Israel's thought of a neighbor was a fellow countryman. Jesus gives an expanded understanding of this commandment, that neighbor meant all people, in all places, no boundaries. The scribe agreed with Jesus on his response to his

question and no one asked him any more questions.

To love God is to be tied to the way we love neighbor, they cannot be separated. To give evidence that we love God, we show through love of neighbor. How do we love our neighbor?

There are many answers, but one to reflect on is to show respect towards others. After this difficult election cycle, we as Christians need to reflect on how we can better show respect towards others. A willingness to give dignity, give the benefit of the doubt, to listen to others. I believe the most practical way to show love of neighbor is to be respectful to everyone. In our language towards others, in our treatment of others, and to overcome the temptation to respond in unkind ways when provoked. It is not easy, yet Jesus says the commandment to love our neighbor is one of the greatest commandments.

Our theme I WILL LOOK TWICE UNTIL I SEE CHRIST IN YOU continues through the upcoming Advent season. I invite everyone to think differently after this past election and give the best Christian witness to the world. In the Acts of the Apostles, the Church grew because people who saw them said, "see how they love one another." A good reminder for everyone in the days ahead.

## The Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On November 21 we celebrate the feast of the presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast mirrors the celebration of the presentation of Jesus in the Temple. The feast is intended to tell us something about Mary to help us grow closer to her and better understand her unique role as Mother of God. Growing closer to Mary always draws us closer to her son. Likewise, our understanding of Jesus reveals to us who Mary is as the Mother of God.

But where does this feast come from? If you haven't noticed, the bible doesn't give any account of Mary's childhood. The feast was first celebrated in the Eastern Church in the 6th century where a church in Jerusalem was dedicated to this mystery. As its significance grew, it was later adopted in the West in the 11th century. The story of the presentation of Mary is taken from the apocryphal book of the Protoevangelium of James. The story tells us of Anna and Joachim, the parents of Mary, who offered Mary to God in the Temple when she was three years old. This was to carry out a promise made to God when Anna was childless.

Although the apocryphal source is seen as unhistorical, Mary's presentation serves an important theological purpose. The feast shows us that from the earliest moments of her life Mary was consecrated to God and set apart. The entire life of Mary from her immaculate conception to her dormition is a sign of the glory of God. The feast emphasizes that the

holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued through her childhood and beyond. God had a unique plan for Mary and sanctified her in a unique way in his saving plan. Mary's dedication to God and her life of holiness is also an example to all of us. She is a reminder that we too are temples of God who share in His saving plan.

Just as Mary was dedicated to God, we too should set our lives apart from the rest of the world. To be holy is to be set apart. As we go forward this week, ask the question, how can we set our lives apart? How can we better dedicate our lives to serving God? What can we do to make the Kingdom of Heaven realized here and now? And finally, how can Mary help us grow closer to her Son? Allow this week to be an opportunity to set your life apart for God and allow Mary to guide you along the way.

#### **Social Justice**

On Monday, December 9, immediately following our 6:30 pm Advent Mission Speaker, we will be assembling 4,000 Bags of Compassion. These bags will then be dispersed by parishioners to people experiencing homelessness in our community. Why do we call them "Bags of Compassion"? Not only is this an outward expression, but this act of charity invites us to look inward.

Compassion is one element we strive for on the path and journey towards discipleship. In our daily encounters, it is only ONE of the characteristics and underlying traits that Jesus asks us to exemplify in our Christian lives as we embrace discipleship and live out the gospel. Compassion is a little easier to define, yet one of the most difficult AND frustrating traits to develop and sustain. In other words, it takes practice. It is through lived experiences and consistent exposure to the broken that gives a better understanding of how compassion works in our lives. It is natural to want to flee or ignore the suffering. Yet, the more that one is exposed to the broken (addiction, mentally ill, the imprisoned, the trafficked, the chronic homeless, the faceless immigrant, etc.), the closer we move towards learning how compassion develops and works in our own hearts, therefore helping us in our own journeys of living out the gospel. Regular exposure yields to relationship-building, which yields towards better understanding and compassion for the person's plight.

Is compassion nature or nurture or both? Is compassion instinctual or learned? It's an ebb and flow process. Compassion takes practice in our daily encounters. One may find themselves going home and saying "I understand." Then you may find yourself going home another day saying, "I was so judgmental and callous to that person." Recognition of our own shortcomings and attitudes is part of that process.

#### Henri Nouwen says this:

"Let us not underestimate how hard it is to be compassionate. Compassion is hard because it requires the inner disposition to go with others to the place where they are weak, vulnerable, lonely, and broken. But this is not our spontaneous response to suffering. What we desire most is to do away with suffering by fleeing from it or finding a quick cure for it. As busy, active, relevant [people], we want to earn our bread by making a real contribution. This means first and foremost doing something to show that our presence makes a difference. And so we ignore our greatest gift, which is our ability to enter into solidarity with those who suffer. . . . "

"Those who can sit with their fellow man, not knowing what to say but knowing that they should be there, can bring new life into a dying heart. Those who are not afraid to hold a hand in gratitude, to shed tears of grief, and to let a sigh of distress arise straight from the heart can break through paralyzing boundaries and witness the birth of a new fellowship, the fellowship of the broken."




