Stewardship

Today's readings challenge us to focus on the "why" of stewardship. Why embrace this challenging way of life when it seems hard enough just to pay the bills, take care of our loved ones, meet the demands of our jobs, and fall into bed at the end of each full day? Because this life is not all there is. We were made for more — for eternal happiness in union with God. While we cannot earn our way into Heaven, what we do now with the life God has given us has eternal consequences. Stewardship living helps us to keep focused on our hoped-for destination in the choices we make each day.

In our Gospel passage from Luke, Christ reminds us very clearly that we were made for more than just this life and that our choices in this life have eternal consequences. In this passage, our Lord corrects some Saducees for their mistaken notion that there is no resurrection. He instructs that "those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead...can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise."

Stewardship is not ultimately about the amount or kind of time, talent, and treasure we offer. It is about the conviction that everything we have is a gift from our loving God whom we can never truly repay and with whom we want to live forever. Revisiting these three aspects of our lives regularly, prayerfully discerning the best use of our gifts, and putting this down in writing clarifies and strengthens our conviction to put God first. It is a clear guide and a powerful aid in living out this conviction in concrete ways day-by-day.

That is the "why" of stewardship.

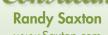
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Social Justice....Megan Popa

As the Social Justice and Outreach Coordinator, I get many opportunities to witness the great generosity of our parishioners and others in the community all throughout the year! I was amazed once again as we gathered over 360,000 bottles of water this summer for the thirsty. This October, over the course of two weekends, our Men's Club collected enough clothes to fill a 20-foot U-haul truck, which was then donated to St. Joseph the Worker! However, if I had to pick a time of year, or season, that really stands out when it comes to generosity, it would have to be the one we are entering into now. We are in the first week of November, which means in the next couple of weeks, we will start sharing information about our Giving Tree and Adopt-a-Family programs. And as we enter into Advent, you will be encouraged to bring donations of white socks with you to Mass each week. The generous response to all these different giving opportunities this time of year always blows me away... and I'm sure this year will be no different!

This got me thinking, however, about the idea of generosity in general. For some, generosity comes naturally and for others, it can be more of a challenge. A lot of times when we think of giving and generosity, the first things that come to mind are giving money or goods (that usually cost money!). And while this is certainly wonderful (and appreciated!), for some people this is easier or more possible than it is for others. But, there are actually many ways we can practice generosity during this season that go beyond simply giving of our monetary resources. You can be generous with...

- ~ your time: volunteer, put in the effort to build a relationship, give a listening ear
- ~ your words: say thank you, give encouragement, express love, give compliments
- ~ your attention: stop multitasking and give someone your full attention, don't interrupt
- ~ your hospitality: make someone feel welcome, include others who may be left out
- ~ **your talent:** share a knowledge/expertise, teach someone something
- ~ **your mercy:** forgive someone (or yourself!), apologize when necessary
- ~ **your acceptance:** try to see things from another point of view, give others the benefit of the doubt, assume positive intent

Pope Francis said, "Let us ask the Lord for the grace of being generous, so that our hearts may be opened and we may be kinder." The next couple months will present many ways, big and small, that we can give to others in need. We certainly hope that you will jump in where you can! At the same time, maybe we can all take on the challenge this year to let the spirit of generosity infiltrate all aspects of who we are!

Social Justice

Several of our ministries here at St. Patrick focus on serving and forming relationships with organizations whose focus is assisting people who face irregular access to food on a daily basis. During the summer months, lunch meals are made in our kitchen and sent to Justa



Center. Food is collected at our weekend Masses and sent to various nonprofits. Centers like André House, Paz de Cristo, and St. Vincent de Paul serve meals to those experiencing homelessness or those struggling at home to put food on the table. We have also made a relationship with Waste Not, a food rescue organization located in Scottsdale.

Some of our parishioners just recently participated and completed the eight-session Just Faith adult formation program which focused on Hunger and Food Insecurity. The sessions shed light on this topic through readings, prayer, videos, reflection, and conversation within the group. One of the main topics that was highlighted during these sessions is the identification between Food Insecurity vs. Hunger. There is a difference:

Food Insecurity: This is a technical term used when describing hunger and is a consequence of hunger. It is defined as "a lack of access to enough healthy food to live a healthy lifestyle" (the keyword here being "healthy"). Meals tend to be high in calories and low in nutrition. Cheap and easy. Foods tend to be high in sodium and sugars, high carbs, processed, and infused with preservatives. Think of this term as a subcategory of hunger. The "hunger" here is access to nutritional meals.

Hunger: Someone whose food intake is/was reduced because of a lack of resources for any food in general. Lack of resources could be economical due to loss of job, low paying job, or a life event(s) that led to poverty. It can also be geographical like living in a far region too far away from food access combined with lack of transportation. Those who need to take public transportation are unable to purchase perishable items. Or, many work six days a week and simply do not have the time or the energy to navigate the complicated systems and put off shopping altogether.

The commonality between these two terms is that there is a lack of choices and options. Choices bring balance. Lack of choices brings unbalance. This is the common path when this occurs:

Lack of access/resources \rightarrow Hunger/Food Insecurity \rightarrow Poor nutrition \rightarrow Health issues \rightarrow Medical bills \rightarrow Debt \rightarrow Making choices about skipping meals, eating low nutritional food, or paying bills. It's a cycle that is incredibly hard to stop.

"Lord, open our eyes, open our ears, open our hearts that we may see your brothers and sisters who struggle with hunger. Renew in us your Spirit." Amen
