

Stewardship

How does one measure love? Is it by the number of times you say it to your loved one? Is it by the number of romantic gestures or love notes or "blowing kisses" emojis used in text messages?

Of course not! Because what love requires is far greater than what words can achieve.

It's easy to say "I love you" but living it out requires a whole different level of surrender. This week's Gospel demonstrates this point beautifully. Talk is cheap. The son who says he'll serve the father but fails to is outshone by the one who initially declines but eventually comes to his senses, rises, and heads out. Ezekiel expands on this point, demonstrating how those who live a virtuous life — not those who merely talk about it — will receive their reward, while those who sin do not act in line with the Lord's way and will suffer the consequence. Our actions speak louder than our words because actions matter.

This really is the root of the Incarnation that St. Paul is explaining to the people in Philippi in the second reading. God is not a "do as I say, not as I do" kind of God. No, God says "do what I did." God humbled Himself by "emptying himself" and "becoming obedient to the point of death ... on a cross." The cross goes far beyond words. Jesus didn't just say "I love you" to the Father or to us; He lived it out with every action, and His cross was the exclamation point. It's not enough for us to say that we love the Lord; it ought to be readily visible in our daily actions and crosses. If there is no willingness to sacrifice for the other, it is not true love.

Reviewing Medicare Coverage


This is important! If your Medicare coverage includes Part D Prescription Drug Plan or Medicare Advantage Plan, be sure to review your health coverage YEARLY!

Social Justice



"The Catholic Church teaches that violence against another person in any form fails to treat that person as someone worthy of love. Instead, it treats the person as an object to be used." The Catholic Bishops of the United States

With October being Domestic Violence Awareness Month, it is important to understand the certain aspects of how the law "defines" this societal issue. This definition is taken directly from Arizona Revised Statute ARS 13-3601 which explains the relationship criteria that is used by law enforcement to determine categorically if an act of domestic violence has occurred:

- 1. The relationship between the victim and the defendant is one of marriage or former marriage or of persons residing or having resided in the same household.
- 2. The victim and the defendant have a child in common.
- 3. The victim or the defendant is pregnant by the other party.
- 4. The victim is related to the defendant or the defendant's spouse by blood or court order as a parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, brother or sister or by marriage as a parent-in-law, grandparent-in-law, stepparent, step-grandparent, stepchild, step-grandchild, brother-in-law or sister-in-law.
- 5. The victim is a child who resides or has resided in the same household as the defendant and is related by blood to a former spouse of the defendant or to a person who resides or who has resided in the same household as the defendant.
- 6. The relationship between the victim and the defendant is currently or was previously a romantic or sexual relationship. The following factors may be considered in determining whether the relationship between the victim and the defendant is currently or was previously a romantic or sexual relationship:
 - (a) The type of relationship.
 - (b) The length of the relationship.
 - (c) The frequency of the interaction between the victim and the defendant.
 - (d) If the relationship has terminated, the length of time since the termination.


