

Pope Francis General Audience at the Vatican on October 20, 2021:

"Jesus tells us, 'If you do not become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of God.' It is the courage to be close to the Lord, to be open to the Lord, to not be afraid of the Lord. I thank this child for giving this lesson to all of us," the Pope said.

"There is no freedom without love," Pope Francis said. "The selfish freedom of doing what I want is not freedom because it comes back to yourself, it isn't fruitful."

"It is Christ's love that has freed us, and again it is love that frees us from the worst slavery, that of the self; therefore, freedom grows with love," he said.

The freedom St. Paul writes about does not imply "a libertine way of living, according to the flesh or following instinct, individual desires or one's own selfish impulses," the Pope said. Rather, the apostle speaks of a freedom that is "fully expressed in love."

"It is the love that shines out in gratuitous service, modeled on that of Jesus, who washes the feet of his disciples and says, 'I have given you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you;' to serve one another," the Pope said.



In Matthew 11:28, Jesus tells us "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."



Do you have a child ready to prepare for First Reconciliation, Confirmation or First Communion?

Parent Orientation

Sunday, October 16th, 3 PM Fenlon Hospitality Center

Sacrament Orientation is for parents and geared towards adults, so if you need to bring a child for childcare purposes, you are welcome to do so, but plan accordingly.



Sacramental Prep

In order to prepare for the Sacraments of Reconciliation (typically 2nd grade), First Communion, and Confirmation (typically 3rd grade), you must:

- Have prepared for and celebrated Baptism (and Reconciliation for Confirmation & First Communion).
- Be participating in formation or enrolled at a Diocesan Catholic School. Formation includes Family Faith Formation OR Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS/Atrium) OR ROCK45 (youth in 4th or 5th grade only).
- Have one parent or more attend a Parent Orientation.

Registration for Sacraments follows attendance at a Parent Orientation.

Social Justice

One tool or option to help keep an abuser away from you is to obtain an Order of Protection (OP) which can be issued from Superior court, any Justice of the Peace court (JP), or any Municipal court in Arizona during normal business hours. A

law enforcement officer can help you obtain an Emergency Order of Protection after business hours or on holidays. An OP is only valid for 12 months after it has been served. If the person served violates the stipulations within this order, he or she can be arrested and jailed for this violation.



When applying for this order, you can and should stipulate that the person is to have no contact whatsoever either in person, by phone, electronically, or through social media. This order must be served by a process server (at your cost) or by a law enforcement officer (no cost). Once the order is served to the offender, the paperwork will be forwarded to the Maricopa Co. Sheriff's Office and is kept on file; you should keep a copy as well. Keep in mind, however, that an OP is merely a piece of paper that obviously will not physically restrain someone from staying away should they choose to violate the order. It does not guarantee safety, so always be cognizant of your surroundings.

An OP seeks protection from someone you have lived with now or in the past. This applies to a current or former spouse, someone with whom you are having a romantic relationship, one party pregnant by the other party or have a child in common, your relative (ask the court for specifics), or one of the parties is a parent, grandparent, in-law, or sibling. Go to azpoint.azcourts.gov/ to get started.

For any emergency, call 9-1-1 and get to a safe place. For any other non-emergency concerns around domestic violence, call the National Domestic Violence Hotline 24/7 at 1-800-799-7233 (SAFE).



Just Chocolate ministry is deliciously returning this weekend for our seventh year and we are excited to be back selling Divine Chocolate products!


