Encharistic Ministers: Bringing Christ to Others

As we come to Mass each week it can be easy to forget those who work behind the scenes and contribute to making the Mass a beautiful celebration and a place of welcome for all. The truth is everyone plays a special role in the celebration of the Mass, from the priest to the cantor, lectors, gift bearers, the choir and congregation, to the Eucharistic ministers. Even from the pews we are called to actively participate in the Mass through our prayers, through our singing, and by bringing our gifts to the altar. Through our very baptism we are called to actively participate in the Mass every Sunday. One great way to get more involved and become a part in serving the community is by becoming a Eucharistic minister.

In 1910, Pope Pius X called for Catholics to receive Holy Communion frequently. With a growing need to distribute Communion more frequently and to a growing population, in 1973 Pope Paul VI released Immensae Caritatis, allowing lay persons to act as ministers of Communion as in the early centuries of the Church. There has been a long history of Eucharistic ministers in the church, but the primary role of a Eucharistic minister is to assist at Mass in distributing the Body and Blood of <u>Christ to the community.</u> Here at St. Patrick, we are currently looking for Eucharistic ministers to help distribute the Precious Body and Blood of Christ during Mass.

As you know due to COVID, we paused distributing the precious blood at Mass. It is our hope to bring back Holy Communion under both species of bread and wine. But in order to do this, we need more Eucharistic ministers. Being a Eucharistic minister may not be in your comfort zone, but God rarely calls us to be comfortable; rather he challenges us to give of ourselves to serve and love those around us. Becoming a Eucharistic minister can deepen your own devotion to the Eucharist while also being an example to the rest of the faithful by their piety and reverence to the sacrament of the altar.

Get on the Bus (GOTB) unites children with their incarcerated Mothers for Mother's Day. Started in 2017, GOTB had 6 families participate. In 2024, we had 94 families engaging 353 participants served by GOTB with several other Ministries and supported by our Parish.

We expect the program to grow in 2025 as we unite more families increasing our costs. It cost \$15,000 in 2024 and is anticipated to be \$20,000 in 2025. We see the remarkable difference this day makes in these families and their mothers.


