ADULT INITIATION, A WONDERFUL GIFT...with Lenny Kelley

The Adult Initiation process is a wonderful gift from God. How often do we get to take time and reflect on who we are, what we are made for, who is God, and what life is really all about? If you're like me, not very often.

For most of us, the busyness of life gets in the way of discovering who we truly are and what we are truly called to be. It is challenging to ask ourselves who God calls us to be when we are trying to figure out how we

will afford our rent or braces for our teenager.

Adult initiation gives us nine months at one and a half hours a week to discover things about ourselves, our God, and our community we don't often have time to think about. We are allowed to discover more about ourselves and our relationship with God. Some may view this time offered for the enrichment of ourselves as selfish. I disagree. When we discover who we are and our purpose in this world, we can become the gift to others we are intended to be. We can serve others with the gifts God has given us.

The adult initiation process is broken into four parts (1) Inquiry, (2) Catechumenate, (3) Purification and Enlightenment, and (4) Mystagogy. These four parts allow the participants to dive deep into self-reflection to better understand their formation as human people.

The inquiry period at St. Patrick Catholic Community is eight weeks long. During the inquiry, we offer a deeper look into topics such as "What is the Mass," "The Liturgical Calendar," and "Who is Jesus." Inquiry is a time when the adult initiation team introduces those inquiring about our faith to the Gospel values our Catholic identity is built upon.

The catechumenate is begun with a RITE celebrating the beginning of a journey moving towards joining the body of Christ with the sacrament of baptism and joining the Church with the other two sacraments of Initiation, Confirmation and First Eucharist. The Inquirer is now considered a catechumen, someone discerning joining the Church. The entire St. Patrick Catholic Community prays with you for your discernment into joining the mystical Body of Christ.

The period of purification and enlightenment is when the individual takes a deeper look into their lives, letting go of things holding them back from building a holy relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ. The Catechumens are encouraged to let go of sin and change their lives to mimic and imitate the life and way of our Lord Jesus Christ. This period is immediately before the individual will receive the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and First Eucharist) at the Easter Vigil. St. Patrick Catholic Community begins this period in the first week of Lent.

Finally, the period of mystagogy starts immediately after the Easter Vigil. This period reminds our Catholic brothers and sisters who were officially made members of the Catholic faith and who are now members of the Body of Christ that our faith journey is a lifelong process. The sacraments of initiation are just the beginning of our Catholic life. We will always have to work on our prayer life and relationship with the Lord.

Social Justice

For the victims of domestic abuse: "Don't they know it takes an average of seven attempts before a victim leaves an abusive relationship? Don't people understand that I

live in darkness but am even more afraid of the darkness of the unknown ahead of me?"

WE PRAY: Hear the cries of our brothers and sisters, Lord, who have been gravely harmed, and the cries of those who love them. Soothe their restless and



burdened hearts with hope, steady their shaken spirits with faith. Grant them justice for their cause, enlightened by your truth. Holy Spirit, comforter of hearts, heal your people's wounds and transform brokenness into wholeness.

For the domestic abuser: "It started simply with name-calling and shaming tactics. My questions begin to be asked more frequently, 'Where were you?' Who were you with?'"

WE PRAY: It's always difficult, Lord, to look at a troubled and abusive person with a compassionate heart. But what is the root of all of this? Is it generational, is it addiction or mental health? Is it an undiagnosed disorder? Or, did something just get out of hand momentarily? Open our eyes to their brokenness.

For the first responders, court employees, and shelter staff: "Several factors can make a domestic violence incident highly dangerous for responding officers..."

WE PRAY: Allow them to be compassionate and understanding to the plight of the victim. Help them to not allow the frequency of such calls to develop a jaded heart, but rather one that responds with courage, empathy, and justice. Protect them and give them courage from any encountered violence. That they may all stand strong to speak and protect a victim who is afraid to speak for themselves so the cycle of abuse and violence will be broken for the victim in order to begin anew.

For our parish: "This is always a difficult topic to understand and to talk about."

WE PRAY: Help us to remember as a faith community and staff that embraces topics that are sometimes difficult to speak about, Jesus engaged with a listening and prayerful heart. Give us that wisdom of heart and mind to help guide our conversations and responses towards faithful understanding. May our charity and justice responses fulfill what you ask in the area of discipleship and love for all. AMEN

Requirements: Active Arizona Nursing License, Safe Environment Training, and CPR.

Other activities: Educational programs, writing bulletin articles, and blood pressure screening at different times of the year. You do not have to have an active license to be part of the educational and screening programs.

It's Flu Season

It is predicted that flu cases will be higher this year. Having the flu can be a miserable two weeks that resolves on its own or it can result in

serious complications leading to hospitalization and death.

Who is at high risk? Age 65 years +, young children, pregnant women, those living in group homes, dorms, and those with chronic medical conditions.

Complications: Sinus or ear infections and bronchitis are examples of moderate complications. Pneumonia and worsening of chronic illnesses are possible serious complications.

Best prevention: Receive a Flu shot


Note: All Diocesan high school students receiving the reduced tuition rate for the coming year must have their status verified by their home pastor before they can be registered as Catholic.


