

Three days this coming week are significant in our Catholic faith. October 31 is known as ALL HALLOW'S EVE, also known as Halloween. What's the deal with Catholics and the Saints?

Years ago, I had a friend who once he found out I was Catholic couldn't help but ask me, "What's the deal with Catholics and all those images and statues of saints?" Before then I had never really thought about it; it seemed normal to me to have statues and pictures of the saints in churches. But honestly I really didn't know much about the saints except that they were really holy people a long time ago. It wasn't until years later when I slowly began to read more and learn about the saints that I realized their importance in the life of the Church. As Catholics we believe in a communion of saints which points to reality beyond this material world.

On November 1, we celebrate the Feast of All Saints. This is a day for us to remember the men and women who have gone before us who dedicated their lives to following Christ. The saints offer us examples of what it means to dedicate your life to God. They affirm our belief that the Kingdom of God is worth sacrificing everything for. This feast has a long tradition and finds its origin around the early fourth century in commemoration of all the Christians who were persecuted and martyred for their faith. Not knowing much about the saints, I often thought it was impossible to be that holy. As Catholics, I think that is the danger for us. We develop a sort of pedestal syndrome. We often place the saints on a pedestal which makes it impossible to relate to them. But in reality they were regular people, just like you and me, searching for happiness and trying to do their best. The saints were sinners too. Learning about the saints is a great way to deepen our own faith.

I encourage you to look up the story of a saint this week and read about their life. To be a saint is not something only a few people are called to be. We are all called to be saints in our own ways.


