First Down with Fr. Eric



Dear Friends,

One of the biggest challenges in living as a Disciple of Jesus Christ, and also living in our world, is that sometimes our world gets to set the agenda if something is good or bad, even if it involves the good things of our Christian faith. One example, out of many, is the celebration of Halloween. There can be a fear and a misunderstanding as to why the Church would say Halloween is one of three special days this coming week. Thinking it is about celebrating evil, horror, and bad deeds is not what Halloween is about for Christians.

All Hallow's Eve is the day before All Saints Day, a special day in the Church. It opens the path to three days that come together for us. Halloween (October 31), All Saints Day (November 1), and All Soul's Day (November 2). We remember that Jesus Christ, through his death and resurrection, has conquered sin and death. We mock evil on All Hallow's Eve because it does not have ultimate victory over us. All Saints Day reminds us that we are connected with those who have gone before us and pray for us, it is called intercessory prayer. They are models of our faith while on earth and they pray for us with the Lord. All Soul's Day is a reminder that the Church on earth is joined with the Church in heaven, we are not forgotten, but from the heavenly banquet they consume the same food as we do at our Eucharistic table. They are not just up there somewhere just waiting for us to show up. Rather, they still are connected to us, and just as the Lord did not lose us when we were born on earth, we do not lose those who return to the Lord.

Christians, we remember not to let other people who do not understand our faith set the agenda, the definition of terms, or how we view the world. The Lord Jesus speaks the language of love, mercy, belonging and victory over all sin and even death itself. Let's celebrate well these three holy days.

Ministry of Care reaches out to those Catholics who are away from the community due to short-term or long-term illness. Currently, St. Patrick Catholic Community serves two hospitals, 17 long-term facilities, and our community members that are homebound.

As you can imagine, the ministry of care needs great support. At this time, we need about 60 new ministers to get us back to our numbers before COVID. There are people who are in the hospital, homebound or in one of the 17 facilities we service who would not be able to receive the Eucharist without this important ministry.

One of our ministers of care shared, "My experience as a Eucharistic Minister for hospital patients has been simply unbelievable. It is hard to put into words how much joy it gives me to be able to bring our Lord to the patients."

Nurses Corner

Breast Cancer Awareness Goes Beyond October! More women are diagnosed with breast cancer than any other cancer, excluding skin cancer. Early detection and advanced treatments continue to decrease mortality rate.

If breast cancer is found during screening exams and before symptoms appear; the cancer is more likely to be smaller and confined to the breast. When breast cancer is found due to symptoms, it tends to be larger and more likely to have spread beyond the breast. Breast cancer also occurs in men.

Major risk factors: Female, advancing age, family history of breast or ovarian cancer, or breast density.

Other factors: Hormone replacement, birth control pills, early menarche, late menopause, obesity, and alcohol.

Screening can save lives:

Do monthly self exams.

Be alert to lumps, changes in breast size, nipple discharge. Don't wait to see your Care Provider for further screening.



Interested in sharing your nursing skills in a parish ministry?

We have a nurse at each Mass to assist the Hospitality Ministers when someone becomes ill or is injured.

The role of the nurse is to assess the situation and determine the assistance that is needed.

You select Mass time and date that fits in your schedule.

Requirements: Active Arizona Nursing License, Safe Environment Training, and CPR.

Other activities: Educational programs, writing bulletin articles, and blood pressure screening at different times of the year. You do not have to have an active license to be part of the educational and screening programs.





Burial Shrouds

Did you know that St. Patrick is in need of people who like to sew, trace crosses, cut out crosses and put them together?

There is a small group of people doing the above and are in need of help. We provide the materials and all of the work can be done at home or at our once a month meeting.

The above process, when finished, is used as Burial Shrouds for Fr. Rick in Haiti. Fr. Rick has been working with the poorest of the poor in Haiti for over 25 years. On a monthly basis an average of 15 men, women, and children are buried mostly due to malnutrition. Fr. Rick goes to the morgue to obtain bodies and gives them a proper funeral. As there are no caskets, the Burial Shrouds are placed over the bodies before being interred.






