Dear Friends,

At the three Masses I had on the weekend of August 26-27, I talked before Mass about the importance of people writing down their prayer intentions and placing them in the offertory baskets near the altar. It is a powerful sign each week that parishioners and guests leave their pews to come forward and place either a financial gift, acts of service or prayer intentions that are written down. At those Masses I read some of the prayer intentions that people have placed in the baskets from many months ago. It gave our parishioners an insight into the intentions that fellow parishioners are praying for and about.

Our parish staff takes those offertory baskets with the parish envelopes and written intentions and we pray over them every Wednesday. Prayer reminds us that we belong to one another in faith, that asking God to continue his blessings over all of us is an important act of faith. I also reminded parishioners that prayers are not just bringing problems to God, rather prayers can ask for continued guidance, giving thanks, and continued blessings on the people we know and love.

How about getting some index cards for home and before leaving for Mass, you take a moment to write down a prayer intention and/or an act of service towards another? This can remind us that we go to Mass for each other, to bring Christ within us to others we belong to in faith.

It is a special moment at Mass when many come forward and place their gifts at the altar of the Lord on Sundays.

Stewardship

"Live and let live" is a popular philosophy in modern culture. The idea that the most respectful thing we can do and be as humans is exceedingly tolerant — refusing to speak into anyone's decisions, way of life, or personal beliefs. While we absolutely must respect the dignity and beliefs of others, is that really loving someone? At what point does natural law and revealed truth supersede social awkwardness or the fear of "judgment" from others?

This week's readings demonstrate that God is not okay with His children sitting on the sidelines with hands clasped over their eyes. No, to follow God means to know Truth and to share that Truth when the time presents itself. This first reading from Ezekiel is a great example of this point, where the listener is warned that if they fail to instruct the wicked, they, too, will be held accountable by God. Put simply — knowledge is power and a failure to share it carried a consequence. The psalmist warns us not to harden our hearts to God's truth and then reminds us of what happened to those who did. Jesus instructs us to bring up transgressions and wrongdoings of another, first to them but then, if necessary, to the authority (the Church) out of love. Christ loves us too much to allow us to sit in our death called sin. St. Paul is so emphatic about it he recaps the commandments but couches it in the command to love one another. He points out that love actually fulfills the law (the commandments of God).

We are called to love one another but that never means turning a blind eye to another's sin. Allowing someone to persist in selfishness and death is not love but the exact opposite. Part of love is truth, and if we fail to share that truth, we are not really fully loving another, are we? "Live and let live" is based on the premise that we want the other person to actually LIVE, and without Christ we are not really living, we are merely breathing.







Today we celebrate National Grandparents Day. Although this day is celebrated in different variations across the world, the United States sets aside the first Sunday after Labor Day to recognize and to honor grandparents and the role they play in the lives of their children's children. Congress officially passed the legislation for this day of recognition and the proclamation was signed by President Jimmy Carter on August 3, 1978.

In part, this legislative proclamation reads:

"Grandparents are our continuing tie to the near-past, to the events and beliefs and experiences that so strongly affect our lives and the world around us. Whether they are our own or surrogate grandparents who fill some of the gaps in our mobile society, our senior generation also provides our society a link to our national heritage and traditions.

We all know grandparents whose values transcend passing fads and pressures, and who possess the wisdom of distilled pain and joy. Because they are usually free to love and guide and befriend the young without having to take daily responsibility for them, they can often reach out past pride and fear of failure and close the space between generations."

Grandparents today serve to bridge the generational connectivity for a family. They also take on responsibilities of being caretaker, mentor, confidant, faith role model, and sharing their wisdom. In some instances, grandparents have had to step in and raise children due to the absence of parents.

For all of our grandparents and surrogate grandparents, may your day be blessed and filled with joy while celebrating the value of intergenerational relationships.

Warning Signs of Suicide

The behaviors listed below may be some of the signs that someone is thinking about suicide.



Talking about:

Wanting to die Great guilt or shame Being a burden to others

Feeling:

Empty, hopeless, trapped, or having no reason to live. Extremly sad, more anxious, agitated or full of rage. Unbearable emotional or physical pain.

Changing behavior, such as:

- Making a plan or researching ways to die.
- Withdrawing from friends, saying goodbye, giving away important items, or making a will.
- · Taking dangerous risks such as driving extremely fast.
- Displaying extreme mood swings.
- Eating or sleeping more or less.
- · Using drugs or alcohol more often.

If these warning signs apply to you or someone you know, get help as soon as possible, particularly if the behavior is new or has increased recently.

There is another choice

Surveys have found in the vast majority of cases, women seeking abortion feel under intense pressure to do so. Therefore, for these women, abortion is not a glorious right by which they are able to reclaim control of their lives; instead it is an "evil necessity" to which they submit to because they feel they "have no choice."

Arizona state law 13-3623.01 provides for the protection of the mother and safety of the baby. It states a parent or agent of a parent can leave an unwanted, unharmed newborn baby at a designated Baby Safe Haven without fear of prosecution or answering any questions, and they can remain anonymous.

A Baby Safe Haven is any of the following:

- Any hospital
- On duty fire stations
- On duty medical technicians
- Designated adoption agencies
- Designated churches





