Dear Friends,

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the Gospel of life. Whenever anyone preaches the Gospel, every homily finds its center in the gift of life. We understand that the teachings of Christ remind us that loving God and loving neighbor are the two greatest commandments. Respect for all life, for every human being, is the expectation of God for every person to live.

In the month of October, the Church invites her people to remember respect for all life. This does not say that the other months of the year we never hear about respect life, it means that this month together we preach as one voice that all life matters to God.

The Church in its teaching, seeks to cast a wide net on life issues. From the moment of conception until one's last natural breath, all life is to be understood as sacred.

Let's be clear that people are free to have an opinion they feel strongly about when it comes to life issues. Because of a personal story, maybe a transformation of heart, a mistake from the past, a realization that our life is a gift from God, whatever our reason, we can resonate around a particular issue. It is human nature to feel close or passionate about something that has touched our lives. The same happens with life issues. We might choose one issue and believe it is the most important. We also should remember that we do not stop there. One issue alone is not enough to respect all life. To be deaf or blind to other life issues is not the way of a disciple of Christ. All life is to be defended, respected, and seen as valuable to society. We are to be consistent with life issues which means we have a core value that covers the entirety of human life.

There may be some who feel disappointed because a particular issue was not exclusively spoken about. That way of thinking can miss the mark. The issue that is important to some, is also included in the preaching and the protection of all human life.

In October we will remember the life issues preached every Sunday because the Gospel of Jesus is life. We broaden our respect for life to cover every life that is part of our humanity.

St. Francis of Assisi The Beauty of Creation

In 1811, born in the small town of Assisi, Italy, young Francis enjoyed a very rich and easy life growing up due to his father's wealth. Contrary to his fathers wishes, after hearing God's call, Francis decided to give up everything he had and dedicate his life to service and prayer. St. Francis took the words of Jesus to heart and made it a part of his life. He really believed what Jesus said, "Preach the kingdom of God... take nothing for your journey, no staff, nor bag, nor bread, nor money (LK 9:1-3)." He gave away to the poor everything he had, even the clothes on his back. He embraced the poverty of the gospel while preaching the message of peace and goodwill to all people. He quickly became known for his compassion and his immense love for the poor and sick. Today, St. Francis of Assisi is still one of the most popular and venerated saints in the Catholic Church.

The life of St. Francis is full of miracles and legends, and I encourage you to read more about his life. But from all the stories and legends surrounding St. Francis we get the same message; this was a man who loved God and knew what it meant to serve the Lord. Encountering the love of God and sharing that love with others is at the heart of Franciscan spirituality. While his preaching was simple, it was also filled with a joy and excitement that drew people to encountering God through a

simplicity of life. St. Francis preached a lot about the beauty of creation as a reflection of the beauty of God. This is most notably seen in his famous prayer "The Canticle of Creation" where he speaks of "brother sun" and "sister moon." For Francis, all of creation was part of his brotherhood. This is the reason St. Francis is considered the patron saint of animals and ecology and why you will often see depictions of him surrounded by animals. In honor of St. Francis of Assisi, pets around the country receive a blessing this month as a sign that all of God's creatures are cherished and beloved.

Here at St. Patrick, we would like to invite you for a Blessing of Pets on Saturday, October 5 at 9:00 am in the House of Mercy Courtyard. We invite you to bring your pets for a special blessing recognizing the love God holds for all his creatures.

In their own ways, when viewed through the eyes of faith, pets can help guide us to recognizing the beauty and love of God in our own lives. The love we give to a pet, and receive from a pet, can draw us more deeply into the larger circle of life, and into the wonder of our own relationship to our Creator. Following the example of St. Francis let us learn to walk the path of peace, simplicity of life, love of creation, and love of God.



Warning Signs of Suicide

The behaviors listed below may be some of the signs that someone is thinking about suicide.



Talking about:

Wanting to die Great guilt or shame Being a burden to others

Feeling:

Empty, hopeless, trapped, or having no reason to live. Extremely sad, more anxious, agitated or full of rage. Unbearable emotional or physical pain.

Changing behavior, such as:

- · Making a plan or researching ways to die.
- Withdrawing from friends, saying goodbye, giving away important items, or making a will.
- · Taking dangerous risks such as driving extremely fast.
- Displaying extreme mood swings.
- · Eating or sleeping more or less.
- · Using drugs or alcohol more often.

If these warning signs apply to you or someone you know, get help as soon as possible, particularly if the behavior is new or has increased recently.
