We enjoy a wide variety of books, both fiction and non-fiction. For example, our first book (November '23) was "The Ear of the Heart", an engaging story about a Hollywood star, Dolores Hart, who abandoned her film career and entered a contemplative monastery.

In January, we read "Waiting For A Miracle: One Mother's Journey to Unshakeable Faith." The author, Cyndi Peterson, joined us via Zoom call and answered questions about her life changing experiences in faith. Cyndi also shared her story at the WFM Prayer Gathering in April: it was a riveting experience for all who attended.

On September 19, we will discuss "The Women", a richly woven story of one woman that shines a light on all women who put themselves in harms' way while serving in Vietnam. Their sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been forgotten.

Every conversation is open, insightful and caring. You can attend every meeting—or just one! If you love books, as Fr. Eric says, "you belong here."
